#### **ELMIRA 6 ONEONTA 4**

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Spencer Brann (UC Davis) went 3-for-4 with three RBI and Dylan Waugh (Ariz. Christian) picked up his second-straight victory as the Pioneers jailed the Outlaws at Damaschke Field. Brann socked an RBI single in the first and Elmira never trailed. He tripled home Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) and then scored on an error as part of a three-run fourth inning to give Elmira a 4-0 edge. The next frame, the Elmira backstop drove in his third run with an RBI single. He also gunned down two Outlaws attempting to steal. Waugh scattered 10 hits over seven innings and held Oneonta to four runs. Oneonta bunched together four runs in the middle innings but would not get closer than two after a three-score Elmira fourth. Clark Wise (Wofford) smashed three hits for the Pios and Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) had two hits and scored twice. Oneonta's Andrew Green (ETSU) in his PGCBL 2012 debut went 4-for-5 with one RBI and three other Outlaws drove in run one each.

# **GLENS FALLS 7 MOHAWK VALLEY 5**

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - The Golden Eagles flew out to a 5-0 lead and then closer Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern) slammed the door shut on a late comeback attempt in a victory over the DiamondDawgs at East Field. Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) and Ross Kivett (Kansas St.) dashed home for the Eagles in the first and then Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) keyed a three-run fourth with a two-RBI double. The Dawgs barked back and drew to within 6-4 in the eighth on RBI from Jack Morrow (Young Harris) and Chris Cruz (Cornell). Mohawk Valley had the potential tying run at the plate in the eighth and go-ahead run batting in the ninth however Cheek closed out the tilt with his sixth save. Emmanuel Forcier and Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) each scored twice for the Eagles Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) paced the Dawgs with three hits; he added one RBI and one run scored.

# **AMSTERDAM 6 WATERTOWN 3**

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Mark Leiter Jr. (NJIT) pitched six strong innings and the Mohawks ran off four scores over the first three innings to whip the Wizards at Shuttleworth Park. In his return to the Rug City, Leiter spun six innings of a five-hitter, allowed two runs and struck out six. He seated nine of the first 11 men he faced. Ed Charlton (NJIT) of the Mohawks mashed his league-leading sixth home in the first inning as the 11th-ranked Tribe led wire-to-wire. Zak Colby (Faulkner) scored on a throwing error in the second and then Nathan Gomez (Marshall) smashed a two-run single in the fourth to help the Mohawks march out to a 4-0 lead. Amsterdam's D.J. Hoagaboon (UAlbany) served up a game high three hits and Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) singled twice; each scored one run. Ed Charlton drove in two runs and scored two runs while Scott Heath (Maine) set a league season high with two sacrifice hits. For the Wizards, Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) and Riley Norton (E. Okla. State) each went 2-for-4 with one RBI. one double and one run scored.

#### **ALBANY 12 NEWARK 9**

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Dutchmen reeled off 12 runs over their final four at-bats to stun the Pilots in a slugfest at Colburn Park. RBI singles from Adam Grace (Erie CC) and Phillip Flach (Samford) pushed Newark out to a 2-0 lead in the fourth. The Albany offense awoke in the sixth with five runs, three of which came on a three-run blast by Ryan Gasporra (Centenary). The two teams traded single scores in the seventh and then Albany posted another five-run frame in the eighth to increase its lead to 11-3. Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) and Jared Martin (Cumberlands) each drove in a run during the inning. Newark came out swinging in the home half of the eighth with six scores on four hits. Adam Grace highlighted the rally with a two-run double. Albany reliever Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) stymied the surge however and forced Newark to leave the bases loaded with the go-ahead run on first. The Dutch added another run in the final frame and Lacosse worked a scoreless ninth to end the 3.5 hour game. Jack Wietlispach went 2-for-5 with two runs and two RBI, Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) scored three runs for the Dutch and Morgan Phillips (Charleston) was 2-for-4 with two runs and one RBI. Josh Crowdus (Delta State) and Adam Grace each had three hits for Newark; Grace finished with three RBI.

\*Newark's Dominick Ruscitti, the 2011 PGCBL Pitcher of the Year, threw a five-hitter over eight innings against Watertown in a 9-2 victory while Derek Mazzio (Saint Louis) of Glens Falls tossed a six-hitter and struck out seven in seven innings to beat Mohawk Valley in a one-run game. Both Ruscitti and Mazzio were named All-PGCBL first team at the end of the season.

**Division Format** 

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular

season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
