ONEONTA 7 COOPERSTOWN 6

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - The Outlaws scored six times in the fifth inning and Nick Cioffi (Towson) pitched out of two tight spots in a win over the Hawkeyes at Doubleday Field. Cooperstown scored twice in the fourth to wash away a 1-0 Oneonta lead. The Outlaws responded with six runs on four hits. Heath Holder (Georgia) sparked the charge with a solo home run and Cody Hough (UC Riverside) capped off the rally with a three-run double. The Hawkeyes packed the sacks in the eighth with no outs and quickly brought in a run. Cioffi entered from the bullpen and induced a double-play ground out and then ended the rally with a strikeout. The home team again filled the bases in the ninth against Cioffi and Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay) tagged a three-run double to pull the Hawkeyes within one at 7-6. Cioffi stranded the potential tying run on second on a fly out to end the game. Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) scored twice for the Outlaws while Chris Blanton knocked in four of Cooperstown’s six runs.

GLENS FALLS 11 ALBANY 8

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) hit a three-run home run and Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) launched a two-run triple to lead the Golden Eagles over the Dutchmen. Albany rallied to score three runs in the top of the sixth inning to take a 6-5 lead; Ben Douglas (So. Idaho), Jared Martin (Cumberlands) and Nick Chapman (UNCG) all collected RBI in the frame. Forcier’s three-run belt in the bottom of the inning came with two outs and pushed the Eagles back ahead. Rodrigue cracked a two out, two-run triple in the seventh and then dashed home on a Buddy Putnam (USF) single as Glens Falls amassed an 11-6 lead. The Eagles and Dutchmen cranked out 13 hits apiece. Five different Golden Eagles had multi-hit games. Ross Kivett (Kansas State) had two hits, two RBI, two runs scored and two walks and Alberto Morales (Clarendon) had two RBI. For Albany, Nolan Gaige (UAlbany) was 4-for-5 with two runs and one RBI, Adam Young (UC Davis) posted three hits and Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) bashed a home run.

WATERTOWN 15 NEWARK 13 (10)

NEWARK, N.Y. - Donald Walter (Cal Poly Pomona) keyed a three-run surge in the top of the 10th and Jonathan Perez (St. Mary’s, Texas) pitched out of a bases-loaded jam to give the Wizards an exciting win over the Pilots. The four-hour game featured seven lead changes, one tie and two ninth-inning rallies. Watertown trailed 11-9 heading into the ninth. The Wizards erupted for three runs on four hits and Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) punched an RBI single through the right side to put Watertown ahead 12-11. Newark’s Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) plated Joe Landi (URI) in the home half of the inning to force a 12-12 deadlock. With runners on first and second in the 10th, Walter served up a single into left field that scored one and two Newark errors added two other Wiz tallies. The Pilots used a two-out rally to load the bases against Jonathan Perez in the bottom of the inning and Adam Grace (Erie C.C.) brought home one run with an RBI single. Perez earned his third strikeout of the frame to end the threat and the game. Watertown and Newark combined for 28 runs on 39 hits and seven errors, 11 pitchers were used.

MOHAWK VALLEY 15 ELMIRA 4

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Chris Cruz (Cornell) went 3-for-6 with two home runs and five RBI and the DiamondDawgs reeled off 15 runs for the second night in a row to pull away from the Pioneers at Dunn Field. Cruz dinged a solo home run in the first and then provided the key blow in a four-run second when he lanced a two-run double. He added his second belt of the night, a two-run blast, in the fifth inning. Mohawk Valley’s offense scored at least once in six of eight at-bats and pulled together 10-unanswered runs after Elmira’s Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) slammed a three-run home run in the second to cut an early MV lead to 5-4. Eight Dawgs had at least one hit and six post multi-hit efforts. Jack Morrow (Young Harris) and Eddie Sorondo (Delaware State) each had two hits and two RBI and Eric Helmrich (Marist) scored three times. After yielding four runs in two frames, Eddie Fitzpatrick (Brown) strung together four scoreless innings in a row and Ray Morton (NSU) retired nine of the 12 men he faced.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9
Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.
Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
