### MOHAWK VALLEY 5 ALBANY 0 (GAME 1)

ALBANY, N.Y. - Jesse Buratt (Baton Rouge CC) threw a complete game no-hit shutout and Jack Morrow (Young Harris) and Joe Carcone (Bryant) each drove in two runs as the DiamondDawgs won their sixth in a row. Buratt's no-hitter is the first in the history of the PGCBL. He walked two, struck out three and faced just two batters over the minimum in the seven-inning game. Albany managed just four base runners against Buratt on two walks, a hit batsman and an MV error. Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) tripled and then scored the eventual game winner on a wild pitch in the first. Joe Carcone smashed a two-run triple in the second and then Morrow put the game out of reach with a two-run single in the seventh. Albany starter Cody Tollison (MTSU) struck out seven in six innings but allowed three runs on five hits.

### MOHAWK VALLEY 11 ALBANY 3 (GAME 2)

ALBANY, N.Y. - Mark Stuckey (Marist) went 3-for-4 with five RBI and the DiamondDawgs roared out of the gate with eight scores over the first three frames to earn a doubleheader sweep of the Dutchmen. Stuckey doubled three times in the game and accounted for seven of MV's 11 runs. He smashed a two-run double and scored in the first and then belted another RBI double in the second. Stuckey added his third two-bagger and second two-run double sixth. The Dawgs doubled six times overall and pounded out 11 runs on 15 hits to earn their seventh win in a row. Six MV batters recorded multiple hits led by Mark Stuckey and Chris Cruz (Cornell) who had three apiece; Cruz also scored three runs and had two outfield assists. Eric Helmrich (Marist) was 2-for-4 with three RBI while Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) and Jack Morrow (Young Harris) each had two hits, two runs scored and one RBI. Albany compiled 11 hits. Adam Young (UC Davis) was 3-for-4. Morgan Phillips (Charleston), Nolan Gaige (UAlbany) and Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) all had two hits and one RBI.

### ONEONTA 13 COOPERSTOWN 1

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Taylor Hicks (Georgia) allowed one run over 7.2 innings and the Outlaws recorded season highs in runs (13) and hits (19) in a romp over the Hawkeyes at Dasmashke Field. Hicks held the Hawkeyes scoreless through the first seven frames but yielded a run in the eighth. He scattered eight hits, walked four and struck out two in his first win of the summer. Oneonta's offense scored three times in the first and then exploded for 10 runs between the fourth and sixth innings. Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) hit RBI singles in the first and fourth and then he mashed a two-run triple to highlight a four-run sixth. Wiel finished 3-for-4 with four RBI and two runs scored. Forrest Johnson (Notre Dame) smacked three hits and added three RBI and two runs. Zach Lucas (Louisville) went 3-for-5 with two runs scored and one RBI and Cody Hough (UC Riverside) had two hits, two RBI and two tallies. Seven Outlaws had multiple knocks in Oneonta's 19-hit barrage. For Cooperstown, Jacob Hubert (Laredo C.C.) went 2-for-4 with one RBI.

### ELMIRA 9 GLENS FALLS 4

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Matt Holling (Hofstra) pitched a four-hit shutout for seven innings and Landon Prentiss (VCU) went 4-for-4 with three RBI to lead the Pioneers past the Golden Eagles in front of over 2,900 fans at Dunn Field. Holling spread out four hits, walked three and struck out eight in his first victory. He retired 10 of the final 12 batters that he faced. Elmira scored early and often with four runs in the first and then five in the third to take a 9-0 advantage. Landon Prentiss capped off the five-run rally in the third with a three-run double. Zac Bellinger (VCU), Graeme Zaparynzski (Slippery Rock) and Corey Hamula (Sullivan County CC) also drove in runs for the Pioneers. Bellinger added his league leading 14th double and scored twice as did Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian). All four runs scored by Glens Falls came in the eighth inning. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) hit a two-RBI single. Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) and Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) also drove in runs during the inning. Griffin led the Golden Eagles with two hits.

## AMSTERDAM 16 NEWARK 12

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Mohawks scored a franchise and league record 13 runs in the top of the seventh and then held off a late charge of 11-unanswered tallies by the Pilots to win a re-match of the 2011 PGCBLCS. Before the offensive fireworks began, Amsterdam led 3-1 through six. The Mohawks scored 13 seventh-inning runs on 10 hits and 19 batters came up to the plate. Brian Ruby (Binghamton) had three RBI in the frame and he was one of seven Mohawks to drive in a run during the seventh. Newark responded with eight runs immediately after the seventh inning stretch on three hits and five walks. The Pilots added two more scores in the eighth and one in the ninth. Newark had the potential tying run at the plate in the bottom of the ninth with the bases loaded and one run home but Amsterdam closer Chase Williamson (Auburn) slammed the door shut on the rally with a strikeout. The game featured 28 runs on 29 hits and there were eight pitchers used. The seventh-inning alone had 21 tallies on 13 hits. Amsterdam's Zak Colby (Faulkner) went 5-for-6 with two RBI and three runs scored. Chase Green (SIUE) had four hits and Brian Ruby drove in four runs. Three Pilots drove in two runs apiece. Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) had three hits, two RBI and two runs scored and Cash Barker (TAMUK) plated one run and scored three times.

**Division Format**

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

**Eligibility Requirements:** Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

**Roster Limit:** 30 players

**Playoffs:** August 3 - August 9

**Playoff Teams:** Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

**Format:** Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
