# NEWARK 12 WATERTOWN 5 (GAME 1)

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Pilots lumped together 10 runs between the third and sixth innings to fly away from the Wizards in the first game of a doubleheader. Watertown's Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) blasted a three-run home run to highlight a four-score first for the Purple and Gold. Newark took advantage of several Watertown miscues to score three unearned runs in the third. Back-to-back extrabase hits from Josh Perez (Delta State) and Joe Landi (URI) coupled with a Brent Langston (Delta State) RBI single pushed the Pilots into the lead in the fourth. The Newark offense erupted for six runs on five hits in the fifth, Langston and Cash Barker (TAMUK) each drove in two scores in the frame. Pilots' starter Daniel Thorpe (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) struck out eight in six innings for his fifth win. All nine Newark starters had at least one hit. Brent Langston, Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) and Josh Crowdus (Delta State) all had two hits and scored twice. For the Wiz Kids, Derek Hagy (UTPA), Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) and Peter Rajkovich (San Joaquin Delta) all had two hits apiece; Gleason drove in one run.

# NEWARK 6 WATERTOWN 5 (12) (GAME 2)

NEWARK, N.Y. - Chris Doyle (UC Davis) served up a single into center field that scored Josh Perez (Delta State) in the bottom of the 12th inning to give the Pilots their second walk-off win in three games. The back-and-forth twin bill night cap scheduled for seven frames saw one tie and two lead changes. Watertown rallied from deficits of 3-0 and 5-4 to draw even in the sixth on a bases-loaded walk to Jordan Enos (Holy Cross). In the 12th, Josh Perez led off with a single and back-to-back errors loaded the bases setting up Doyle's game-winning hit. Newark relievers Mark Scott (San Joaquin Delta) and Chris Rogers (Okla. Baptist) combined for 6.1 shutout innings and 12 strikeouts. Watertown reliever Jonathan Perez (St. Mary's, Texas) fired 3.2 scoreless innings. Josh Perez paced the Pilots with three hits and Brent Langston (Delta State) smacked a two-run home run. Jordan Enos and Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) each had two RBI for the Wiz; Gleason socked three hits.

# GLENS FALLS 4 AMSTERDAM 3 (10)

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) hit a two-run home run in the 10th inning to lift the Golden Eagles to their third victory over the Mohawks. Forcier's one-out blast over the right-field fence broke a 2-2 tie that had been forged in the eighth inning when Ross Kivett (Kansas State) of the Golden Eagles smacked a game-tying RBI single. Amsterdam's Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) doubled and scored on an error in the home half of the 10th but the Mohawks could only muster one run against Glens Falls' closer Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern). The three hour and 31-minute game featured a pair of ties at 1-1 and 2-2 as well as a pitchers' duel between Mark Leiter Jr. (NJIT) of Amsterdam and Cory Folk (Buffalo) of Glens Falls. Leiter allowed one run on one hit through six and struck out nine while Folk gave up two runs, one unearned, on five hits in six and struck out two. Ed Charlton (NJIT) drilled an RBI double for the Mohawks and had two hits. Emmanuel Forcier finished 2-for-4 with three runs scored.

### **MOHAWK VALLEY 12 ONEONTA 5**

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Eric Helmrich (Marist) and Chris Cruz (Cornell) each slammed a home run and John Means (Fort Scott CC) tossed a two-hitter over seven innings as the DiamondDawgs earned their ninth-straight win. With the game tied at four in the home half of the fourth following a four-run Oneonta rally, Chris Cruz dinged a tworun swat to give Mohawk Valley the lead for good. Cruz added an RBI single in a fiverun eighth for the Dawgs that was highlighted by a three-run home run from Eric Helmrich. Mohawk Valley reeled off eight scores between the fourth and eighth innings to turn a 4-4 game into a 12-4 rout. John Means did not allow an earned run and retired the first nine men he faced. Five DiamondDawgs slugged out multi-hit efforts and eight starters posted at least one hit. Jack Morrow (Young Harris) drove in two runs and smacked two hits and David Del Grande (Sacramento State) scored thrice. Oneonta's Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) belted a solo home run and finished with two RBI and two runs scored. Shane Crain (Louisville) added two hits and one RBI. ELMIRA, N.Y. -Ben Douglas (So. Idaho) went 4-for-5 with three RBI and the Dutchmen never trailed in a wire-to-wire win over the Pioneers at Dunn Field. Douglas mashed an RBI double and scored as part of a four-run first which saw Albany bang out seven hits and bat around the order. Four frames later, Douglas socked a two-run double that helped increase the Albany lead to 7-0. Elmira rallied and plated six scores over the final five innings including two runs in the ninth. With the potential tying run on deck, Albany closer Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) ended the game with a strikeout. The Dutchmen mashed out 17 hits and eight of nine starters had at least one knock. Nolan Gaige (UAlbany) and Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) each posted three hits and one RBI while Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) and Nick Chapman (UNCG) both had two hits and one run driven in. Ty Yesensky (ODU) was the top Elmira swinger with three hits and two RBI. Travis Rosenwinkel (Corning CC) and Corey Hamula (Sullivan County CC) added two hits apiece.
