# MOHAWK VALLEY 12 WATERTOWN 2

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Five pitchers combined on a three-hitter and the DiamondDawgs reeled off nine-unanswered runs to pull away from the Wizards at Vet's Park. Watertown's Dustin Exford (NE Okla. A&M) clubbed a two-run home run in the fourth inning to cut an early Mohawk Valley lead down to 3-2. The Dawgs quickly responded with two runs in the home half of the fourth and then exploded for seven scores on five hits in the eighth. MV recorded 12 runs for the second consecutive game. Starter Joe Michaud (Bryant) gave up two runs on two hits in five innings and relievers Ray Morton (NSU), Nathan Harrell (Hinds CC), Aaron Casper (Canisius) and Taylor Wright (Brown) held the Wizards to zero runs and one hit in the final four frames. Eric Helmrich (Marist) smashed a two-run triple and topped MV with four RBI. Jack Morrow (Young Harris), Mark Stuckey (Marist) and Jonathan Scott (Bryant) all had three hits; Stuckey doubled twice and scored thrice and Scott drove in two runs. Six of the Dawgs' 14-total hits went for extra-bases.

### AMSTERDAM 10 ONEONTA 1

ONEONTA, N.Y. - The Mohawks scored 10 times over the first five innings and Matt Pirro (Wake Forest) spun a five-hitter for six frames in a win over the Outlaws at Dasmachke Field. Amsterdam battered Oneonta for six runs on nine hits in the first two innings and then added a single score in the fourth and three in the fifth. Six of the Mohawks' 10 runs were recorded with two outs though a four-run second was buoyed by five-straight hits and a throwing error. Overall, Amsterdam smacked out 18 hits for the second-straight road game. Tribe starter Matt Pirro blanked Oneonta through five and yielded just a single score through six. He struck out five for his fourth win. Chase Green (SIUE) went 4-for-5 with one RBI to lead four Mohawks with multi-hit games. Ed Charlton (NJIT), Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) and Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) all had three hits; Charlton scored four times and Papaccio drove in three runs. For Oneonta, Cody Hough (UC Riverside) doubled twice and Heath Holder (Georgia) tripled and scored one run.

## **ALBANY 6 GLENS FALLS 5**

ALBANY, N.Y. - Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) and Nolan Gaige (UAlbany) combined to drive in five runs and the Dutchmen held off a late charge to pick up a win over the Golden Eagles at Bob Bellizzi Field. Down 1-0 on an Alberto Morales (Clarendon) RBI single, Albany loaded the bases in the second and Nolan Gaige tied the game with a two-out infield hit that forced home Ben Douglas (So. Idaho). The next batter, Jack Wietlispach, cleared the bases with a three-run double. Gaige added another RBI in the fourth and the Dutch opened up a 6-1 lead. Ross Kivett (Kansas St) brought Glens Falls back with a two-run double in the seventh and the Eagles tallied twice in the eighth to pull within one. Glens Falls loaded the bases but Albany's Cody White (So. Idaho) induced a force out to end the inning. Ricky Schafer (Cypress) pitched a perfect ninth for the save. Albany starter Blake Smith (Morehead State) earned his first win; he allowed just one run on three hits over six innings.

## ELMIRA 13 COOPERSTOWN 7

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - The Pioneers outscored the Hawkeyes 8-1 over the final four innings to earn a comeback victory at Doubleday Field. Cooperstown's Quinn Pippin (Tulane) broke a 5-5 stalemate in the fifth with a solo home run to right. Elmira responded with four-straight hits to start the sixth that led to three scores. Landon Prentiss (VCU) hit a game-tying RBI single and Aaron Nardone (Delaware State) followed with a two-RBI base hit to give the Pioneers an 8-6 lead. Elmira added three more runs in the seventh and two in the ninth. Zac Bellinger (VCU) buoyed the three score, four-hit seventh with a two-RBI single. The Pioneers finished the evening with 13 runs on 16 hits. Zac Bellinger went 3-for-6 with a three-run home run, five RBI and two runs scored. Ty Yesensky (ODU) and Landon Prentiss each had three hits; Yesensky drove in two runs and Prentiss scored twice. Seven Pioneers scored at least once and six of seven tallied twice. Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) and Quinn Pippin both drove in two runs for the Hawkeyes and combined for five hits.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
