MOHAWK VALLEY 18 COOPERSTOWN 13 (Resumed from 7/2)

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Taylor Wright (Brown) halted a ninth-inning rally and the DiamondDawgs held on for a shootout victory over the Hawkeyes in a resumed game. The contest was originally started on July 2 and suspended due to darkness after seven innings with Mohawk Valley leading 18-9. Cooperstown rallied in the ninth behind a Quinn Pippin (Tulane) grand slam. The Hawkeyes put two more runners on base before Wright entered from the MV bullpen and retired the only two men he faced to end the marathon. The highest-scoring contest in league history saw 31 runs scored on 33 hits in a tilt that ran three hours and 58 minutes. Ten players had multi-hit games and 16 overall recorded at least one hit. All 18 Mohawk Valley runs were scored in the first seven innings highlighted by seven in the first. MV's Mark Stuckey (Marist) went 3-for-4 with four runs scored, three doubles and two RBI while Quinn Pippin of Cooperstown finished with three hits, two runs scored and four RBI.

MOHAWK VALLEY 8 COOPERSTOWN 3

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Eddie Fitzpatrick (Brown) twirled a four-hitter for seven innings and Chris Cruz (Cornell) went 3-for-4 with three doubles and three RBI to lead the DiamondDawgs to their 11th-straight win. Mohawk Valley's 11-game winning streak is longest in league history. Fitzpatrick scattered four hits, allowed one run, walked one and struck out seven in his second win of the week. Cruz plated Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) with an RBI double in the first and then again in the fifth; the second double broke a 1-1 stalemate. Cruz slammed his third double in the eighth as part of a stretch over the final five innings which saw MV outscore Cooperstown 7-2. Chris Cruz and David Del Grande (Sacramento State) each had three hits to pace Mohawk Valley, Jon Scott (Bryant) drove in two runs and Tyler Heck and Tom Valichka (Young Harris) each scored twice. Quinn Pippin (Tulane) posted two RBI for the Hawkeyes and Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) had two runs and two hits.

ELMIRA 8 ONEONTA 6

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) smacked a two-run home run in the eighth inning to push the Pioneers to a victory over the Outlaws at Dunn Field. Oneonta rallied from an early 5-0 deficit and pulled into a 6-6 tie in the top of the eighth. Shane Crain (Louisville) and Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) each drove in one eighth-frame score to bring the Outlaws level. Elmira's Zac Bellinger (VCU) reached on an error to start the home half of the eighth and Tyler McIntyre followed with his fourth home run of the season. James Yacabonis (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) pitched a perfect ninth to seal the victory. Tyler McIntyre finished 2-for-4 with two runs scored and teammate Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) socked two hits and plated two runs. Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) went 3-for-4 and scored twice to lead four different Outlaws with multi-hit performances. Zac Johnson (Illinois State) and Zach Lucas (Louisville) each had two hits, one RBI and one run scored.

NEWARK 6 GLENS FALLS 4

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Pilots rallied to score three unanswered runs to trump the Golden Eagles at Colburn Park. Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) mashed a three-run home run in the Glens Falls' sixth to give the visitors a 4-3 lead. Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher) equalized for the Pilots with an RBI single in the sixth. Brent Langston (Delta State) quickly broke the tie with a run-scoring base hit in the seventh and Josh Perez (Miss. College) added an RBI double to increase the Newark lead to two. Austin McAuliffe (NJIT) spun two shutout frames of relief to earn the victory and Mark Scott (San Joaquin Delta) hurled a scoreless ninth for his fourth save. Josh Perez, Chris Doyle (UC Davis) and Sean Osterman all had two hits for Newark. Starter Derek Dallas (UT Dallas) struck out eight over six innings in a no decision. Chase Griffin drove in all four Golden Eagle tallies on two hits. Anthony Pisani (So. Maine) also had a pair of singles for Glens Falls.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
