GLENS FALLS 7 AMSTERDAM 6

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Alberto Morales (Clarendon) scored on a two-out double by Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) in the bottom of the ninth to give the Golden Eagles a walk-off win over the Mohawks. The wild game featured three ties and one lead change. Amsterdam's Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) forced a 5-5 deadlock in the seventh with a two-RBI single and then he gave the Mohawks a 6-5 lead in the ninth with an another RBI knock. Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) doubled to start the home half of the ninth. Two batters and two outs later, Morales punched home Rodrigue with a game-tying single. Griffin followed with a belt into the left-field corner that plated Morales from first with the winning run. Griffin also launched a massive solo home run for the Eagles and Casey Rodrigue scored three times. Five Mohawks had two hits apiece. Zak Colby (Faulkner) went 2-for-2 with three walks and two runs scored. Chase Green (SIUE) and Ed Charlton (NJIT) each had two hits, one RBI and one run.

ONEONTA 12 ALBANY 3

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Zach Lucas (Louisville) belted a grand slam and the Outlaws scored eight-unanswered runs to down the Dutchmen at Damaschke Field. Albany led 1-0 through four on an Adam Young (UC Davis) RBI double. Lucas swatted away Albany's edge with a two-out grand slam in the fifth. Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) drew the Dutch back within one, 4-3, with a two-RBI double. The Outlaws responded with a six-score surge in the home half of the sixth that was keyed by five hits and two Albany errors. Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) smashed the biggest hit of the rally with a two-run double. Wiel added another RBI single in the eighth. Oneonta's 12 runs were recorded on 12 hits. Eight Outlaws had at least one hit and four tallied multiple runs. Clay Holcomb (Troy) went 2-for-4 with two RBI and Shane Crain (Louisville) had two hits, scored twice and drove in one run. Starter Sheldon Lee (San Francisco) tossed a four-hitter for seven innings and struck out five to claim his fifth victory. Nolan Gaige (UAlbany) compiled two of Albany's three runs.

NEWARK 4 ELMIRA 3

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher) socked a two out, two-RBI single in the eighth inning that propelled the Pilots on to a comeback victory over the Pioneers at Dunn Field. Spencer Brann (UC Davis) and Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) each drove in a run as the Pioneers amassed an early 2-0 lead. The Elmira advantage held until the seventh when a Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) RBI single and an error allowed the Pilots to draw level. With the score tied 2-2 in the eighth, Newark's Josh Perez (Miss. College) singled and he moved to third on a Joe Landi (URI) double. With two outs, Osterman punched a single that plated both runners to give the Pilots a 4-2 lead. Elmira rallied in the bottom of the eighth behind a Spencer Brann RBI single. However, Newark relievers Chris Rogers (Okla. Baptist) and Cullen Babin (Delta State) each forced Elmira to strand the potential tying run on base in each of the final two innings. Pilots' starter Phillip Flach (Samford) hurled a three-hitter for seven innings and fanned five. Elmira's Zac Bellinger (VCU) led both teams with three hits and teammate Clark Wise (Wofford) scored twice.

WATERTOWN 18 COOPERSTOWN 1

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Matt McClain (St. Mary's, Texas) pitched a four-hitter for seven innings and the Wizards erupted for 18 runs on 20 hits to hammer the Hawkeyes. McClain yielded a lone score in the second, walked three and struck out seven in his third win. Cooperstown's Kyle Liner (Binghamton) ripped an RBI double in the second to give the visitors a 1-0 lead. Watertown scored the next 18 runs, all of which came after a 35-minute rain delay in the middle of the second inning. The Wiz Kids plated four each in the second and third, two in the fourth, one in the fifth, three in the sixth and four more in the eighth. All nine Watertown starters had at least one hit and seven of nine posted multi-hit efforts. Donald Walter (CPP) went 4-for-5 with five RBI and three runs scored, A.J. Capone (Saint Rose) clubbed a two-run belt and was 2-for-4 with four tallies and three RBI and Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) had three hits, two RBI and two runs scored. Derek Hagy (UTPA) and Dustin Exford (NE Okla. A&M) also had two RBI each for the Wizards.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
