ONEONTA 3 ELMIRA 1

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Zach Lucas (Louisville) lashed a two-run double in the first and Nathaniel Abel (Virginia) combined with Clay Bates (Clemson) for a five-hitter to give the Outlaws a win over the Pioneers. With two outs and two runners on base in a scoreless first, Lucas slammed a double into left field that plated both Logan Brown (Baylor) and Shane Crain (Louisville). Elmira's Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) cut Oneonta's lead in half in the third on a fielders' choice only to be answered by a Zac Johnson (Illinois State) solo belt in the home half of the frame. Nathaniel Abel logged seven innings and allowed one run on four hits, walked two and struck out five in his first win. Clay Bates tossed two scoreless frames to earn the save; he stranded the potential tying run on base in the ninth. Elmira's Brad Bellinger (St. John's) pitched six innings and allowed three Oneonta runs on six hits.

GLENS FALLS 14 WATERTOWN 4

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - The Golden Eagles used a seven-run fourth and a season high 16 hits to curse the Wizards on Wednesday night at the Duffy Fairgrounds. Entering into the fourth, Watertown and Glens Falls had combined for seven runs in what was a 5-2 Glens Falls lead. The Eagles took off with seven fourth-frame scores on six hits and one Watertown error. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) and Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) each clocked two-RBI singles in the inning. Six of the seven runs in the stanza were scored with two outs. All nine Golden Eagle batters scored at least once, eight of nine had at least one hit and seven of nine had one RBI. Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) went 3-for-5 with four runs scored and two RBI, Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) drove in three runs and Anthony Pisani (So. Maine) was 3-for-4 with two RBI and one run scored. Watertown's Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) and Conor Dishman (Wabash Valley) each had two hits; Dishman drove in two runs.

ALBANY 9 MOHAWK VALLEY 1

ALBANY, N.Y. - Matt Snyder (Va. Tech) spun a one-hitter for 7.1 frames and the Dutchmen pounded out nine runs on 13 hits to defeat the DiamondDawgs. Snyder allowed one run on just one hit, a two-out RBI single in the third by Mohawk Valley's Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.). He walked five, struck out five and stranded four runners on base while reliever Grant DeWitt (Eureka) retired all five men he faced in a combined one-hitter. Albany's Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) ripped an RBI single in the first and then the Dutchmen erupted for four runs on three hits in the second; Nolan Gaige (UAlbany) capped off the rally with a two-run double. Mike Triller (Clemson) added an RBI single in the fourth and then a two-run base hit as part of a three-score sixth. Triller topped the Dutch with three hits and three RBI, Nolan Gaige went 2-for-4 with two RBI and two runs scored and Jon Mestas (Buffalo) tallied three times. Adam Young (UC Davis) and Zach Remillard each had two hits and one run batted in.

COOPERSTOWN 10 NEWARK 8

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Hawkeyes scored six times in the ninth inning to rally past the Pilots in front of 1,975 fans at Colburn Park. Cooperstown's Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay) forced a 4-4 deadlock with a three-run double in the seventh. Newark answered with four scores right after the seventh-inning stretch to go ahead 8-4. In the ninth, Cooperstown took advantage of three Newark errors to plate six runs on three hits. Four different players drove in runs during the inning. The Pilots threatened twice in the ninth but Cooperstown's Josh Anderson (Cypress) induced a momentum killing double play and then forced a game-ending ground out with a runner on third. Chris Blanton led the visitors with four RBI. Colton Beatty (Cal State Stanislaus) and Ty Morris (CSU Monterey Bay) each had two hits and scored twice. Anderson did not allow an earned run in four innings of relief for the win. Chris Doyle (UC Davis) was the Pilots' top gun with two triples, three hits, three RBI and two runs scored. Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher) added two hits and scored twice.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
