NEWARK 12 WATERTOWN 5

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - The Pilots reeled off 11 runs in their final six at-bats to fly away from the Wizards at the Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds. Watertown boasted a 2-1 lead through three. Chris Doyle (UC Davis) recorded the equalizer in the fourth with an RBI fielders' choice and then the Pilots grabbed the lead on fifth-inning RBI from Brent Langston (Delta State) and Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher). Newark's Josh Crowdus (Delta State) smashed a two-run double in the sixth though Watertown's Edgardo Salas (Alcorn State) responded with a two-run belt to cut the Pilots' lead to 6-4. Newark had the answer with three runs in the seventh, two in the eighth and one in the ninth. Josh Crowdus went 4-for-6 with three RBI to lead four Pilots with multi-hit games. Brent Langston slugged a solo home run and finished with three RBI, Josh Perez (Miss. College) had three hits and scored twice and Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) tallied three scores. Edgardo Salas topped the Wizards with three hits and three RBI; Brandon Roush (UTPA) also added a pair of hits and one RBI.

COOPERSTOWN 11 ONEONTA 1

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - James Norwood (Saint Louis) allowed one run over seven innings and the Hawkeyes used two big scoring outbursts to crush the Outlaws at Doubleday Field. Norwood scattered seven hits, walked one and struck out five in his second victory. He yielded a lone run in the seventh on a Clay Holcomb (Troy) RBI single. Cooperstown took command with a six-score third inning and then pulled away with a four-run fifth. Five different Hawkeyes plated runs in the third with the biggest hit being a two-RBI single by Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay). Cooperstown hammered out 11 runs on 14 hits. Eight of nine starters had at least one hit and all nine scored one run. Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) went 3-for-5 with two RBI and Chris Blanton cracked two hits and scored twice. Josh Ingham (CCSU) and Bradley Vanderklas (NKU) each recorded two hits, one RBI and one run. Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) topped the Outlaws with three hits and Cory Hunt (Utah) had two.

AMSTERDAM 12 MOHAWK VALLEY 4

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Ed Charlton (NJIT), Evan Stephens (Wake Forest) and D.J. Hoagboon (UAlbany) combined to drive in eight runs and the Mohawks scored nine times over the final two innings to run away from the DiamondDawgs. The Mohawks' threesome of Charlton, Stephens and Hoagboon collected seven of their eight RBI in the eighth and ninth. Ed Charlton broke a 3-3 tie with a two-run double in the eighth. Charlton and Stephens worked a successful double steal to produce another score and then Charlton and Hoagboon each slashed an RBI single in the ninth. Stephens capped off the rally with a three-run home run. Charlton had two hits in his only two at-bats, scored twice and drove in three runs. Stephens scored three times and cracked three hits and Hoagboon led the 11th-ranked Mohawks with a 4-for-5 performance that included two RBI and two runs scored. Tribe reliever Scott Heath (Maine) slung three shutout innings of relief for the win after starter Matt Gage (Siena) fanned seven in five frames. Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) and Chris Cruz (Cornell) each had two hits and one RBI for the DiamondDawgs.

GLENS FALLS 9 ALBANY 5

ALBANY, N.Y. - Alberto Morales (Clarendon) accounted for four runs and Ryan Skoubo (Tacoma CC) fired four frames of shutout relief to lead the Golden Eagles to their second-straight win. Morales broke a 3-3 tie in the third with an RBI single and then he scored on a two-out triple by Buddy Putnam (South Florida) as part of a three-run inning. The Dutchmen cut the Golden Eagle lead to 6-5 in the fourth but Morales singled to start the fifth and scored on a fielders' choice. He cracked his second RBI single in the sixth to push Glens Falls up by a score of 8-5. Skoubo entered the slugfest in the fifth and held the Albany bats silent for four frames of one-hit relief to pick up his second win in as many appearances. The Golden Eagles pounded out 15 hits and six swingers had multi-hit efforts. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) slammed his third home run and Ross Kivett (Kansas State) and Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) each had two hits and scored two runs. Three Dutchmen produced multi-hit games led by Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) who was 2-for-5 with one RBI and one run scored.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9
Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
