### GLENS FALLS 12 AMSTERDAM 4

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Ross Kivett (Kansas State) went 5-for-5 with a home run, three RBI and four runs scored to lead the Golden Eagles to their fifth victory over the Mohawks. Kivett became just the fourth PGCBL player this season to record a five-hit effort. He doubled and scored in the first, bunted home a run in the second, singled and scored in the fourth, singled home another run in the fifth and then smashed a lead-off home run in the seventh. Overall, the Eagles posted 12 runs on 15 hits and 11 of the 12 runs were recorded in the first five innings. Eight of nine Golden Eagles had at least one hit. Alberto Morales (Clarendon) went 3-for-4 with three RBI, Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) had two hits and drove in two runs and Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) scored three times. Golden Eagle starter Neil Fryer (Siena) held Amsterdam to two runs on seven hits through seven innings and struck out five. For the Mohawks, Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) drove in two runs, Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) went 2-for-4 with one RBI and Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) scored twice.

### NEWARK 7 MOHAWK VALLEY 2

NEWARK, N.Y. - Austin Logan (UC Davis) and Brent Langston (Delta State) combined to drive in five runs and Cullen Babin (Delta State) allowed two scores through six as the Pilots flew away from the DiamondDawgs at Colburn Park. Logan cracked RBI singles in the third, fourth and eighth; his base hit in the third broke a scoreless tie. Langston drew a bases-loaded walk as part of a three-run fourth and then cranked an RBI single in the eighth to increase his overall RBI total to a league-leading 40. Cullen Babin gave up one earned run in six innings and struck out three. Relievers Austin McAuliffe (NJIT) and Mark Scott (San Joaquin Delta) did not allow a run in the final three frames; Scott pitched out of a bases-loaded jam in the ninth and struck out the side. Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) scored three times for the Pilots. Eddie Sorondo (Delaware State) ripped three hits for the Dawgs and Jack Morrow (Young Harris) clubbed a solo home run, his sixth belt of the summer.

### ALBANY 2 WATERTOWN 0

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Blake Smith (Morehead State) pitched a four-hit shutout for 7.1 innings and Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) struck out four in a five-out save as the Dutchmen blanked the Wizards at the Duffy Fairgrounds. Smith retired the first 10 batters he faced and scattered four singles. He struck out four and induced 14 ground outs. Smith pitched the entire game with the lead; Albany scored twice in the first on a Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) sacrifice fly and a Ryan Gasporra (Centenary) RBI single. Trevor Lacosse struck out back-to-back batters with two men in scoring position in the eighth and then he earned a game-ending strikeout with men on second and third in the ninth. Smith and Lacosse combined to allow just six hits. Watertown's Ryann Dunn (CPP) held Albany scoreless for six of his seven innings but yielded two tallies in the first. Jared Martin (Cumberlands) and Adam Young (UC Davis) each had three Albany hits; Young scored one run.

### ELMIRA 4 ONEONTA 1

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Justin Bhatti (Norfolk State) threw a five-hitter for seven innings and Zac Bellinger (VCU) went 2-for-4 with three RBI to lead the Pioneers past the Outlaws in front of 1,670 fans at Damaschke Field. Bhatti blanked the Outlaws through the first six innings and then let in a single run in the seventh. Peter Jay (New Haven) and James Yacabonis (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) each pitched one scoreless frame of relief. Zac Bellinger gave Elmira the lead for good with a two out, two-run single in the first inning and he added a second RBI hit in the third. Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) scored two of Elmira's four runs and he had two hits. Spencer Brann (UC Davis) was 2-for-4 with one run scored and one runner thrown out attempting to steal. Zach Lucas (Louisville) doubled twice for the Outlaws, Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) had two singles and Cody Hough (UC Riverside) socked an RBI single in the seventh inning.

**Division Format**

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.  
**Eligibility Requirements:** Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

**Roster Limit:** 30 players

**Playoffs:** August 3 - August 9  
**Playoff Teams:** Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.  
**Format:** Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
