NEWARK 8 WATERTOWN 6

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Joe Landi (URI) clouded a three-run home run in the ninth inning to push the Pilots past Wizards at Duffy Fairgrounds. Landi's launch was part of four unanswered runs from Newark as the Pilots rallied from a 6-4 deficit. Watertown had led for most of the game behind a three-run home run from Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) in the second. Nine of night's 14 runs were scored in the first two innings. Pilots' reliever Chris Rogers (Okla. Baptist) held the Wizards to one run through five frames and Austin McAuliffe (NJIT) tossed two scoreless innings to earn the win. Chris Doyle (UC Davis) went 2-for-5 with three RBI to pace five different Pilots with multi-hit games. Austin Logan (UC Davis) had two hits and scored two runs. Cole Gleason and Peter Rajkovich (San Joaquin Delta) topped the Wiz Kids with three hits apiece; Gleason had four RBI.

ONEONTA 13 COOPERSTOWN 3

ONEONTA, N.Y. - The Outlaws scored nine times in the first three innings and tied a season high with 13 runs on 21 hits to ground the Hawkeyes at Damaschke Field. Oneonta plated five two-out scores on six hits in the first and then added four more tallies on five hits in the third. Eleven Outlaws had at least one hit, eight recorded at least one run and seven posted at least one RBI. Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) went 4-for-4 with three RBI to lead Oneonta's 21-hit attack. Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) had three hits, scored three runs and drove in two, Heath Holder (Georgia) went 2-for-4 with two RBI and Sutton Whiting (Louisville) smacked two hits and scored twice. Oneonta starter Sheldon Lee (San Francisco) struck out seven over six innings and allowed two runs on six hits to earn his sixth victory. For Cooperstown, Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) and Steven Kandborg (Wenatchee Valley) each went 2-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored.

GLENS FALLS 9 ALBANY 7

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - The Golden Eagles bunched together eight runs between the fifth and sixth innings and then held off a late comeback to defeat the Dutchmen at East Field. Glens Falls held a 1-0 lead through four. The Eagles erupted for four runs on just two hits in the fifth and then Anthony Pisani (So. Maine) highlighted a four-score sixth with a three-run double to put the home side up 9-0. Albany fought back with a five-score seventh on two hits, one of which was a Nolan Gaige (UALbany) two-run single. The Dutchmen added two more runs in the ninth but Albany could not plate the tying tally against Golden Eagle closer Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern). The two sides combined for 27 hits. Anthony Pisani drove in a game high five runs for Glens Falls and Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) went 2-for-4 with three runs scored to lead three Golden Eagles with multi-hit games. Tayler Saucedo (Tacoma CC) pitched six scoreless innings and struck out five to earn the win. Adam Young socked three hits and drove in one run with a ninth-inning RBI triple to lead five Dutchmen with multi-hit efforts. Nolan Gaige had two hits, scored two runs and drove in two more.

AMSTERDAM 6 MOHAWK VALLEY 5

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - For the second time in six days against Mohawk Valley at Shuttleworth Park, Zak Colby (Faulkner) delivered a walk-off hit to give the Mohawks a win over their Mohawk River rivals. Amsterdam scored five runs over the final two rain-soaked innings to earn a comeback victory. Mohawk Valley's Jonathan Scott (Bryant) scored on a wild pitch in the eighth to help the visitors amass a 4-1 lead. The Mohawks rallied in the rainy home half behind a trio of walks that loaded the bases with two outs. Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) drew a two-out free pass, the fourth walk of the inning, to force home a run. Pinch hitter Scott Heath (Maine) followed with a bases-clearing double that pushed Amsterdam ahead 5-4. MV's Eric Helmrigh (Marist) leveled the score in the ninth with a sacrifice fly. A walk, a bunt hit and a hit batsman loaded the bases for Amsterdam in the final half-frame. Colby, who had beaten MV on Tuesday night with a walk-off double, ended the thriller with a walk-off single through the right side. Ed Charlton (NJIT) and Matt MacDowell (Dartmouth) each had two Amsterdam hits; Charlton increased his hit streak to 23 games. Eric Helmrigh knocked in two runs for the Dawgs to increase his season RBI total to 41.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
