GLENS FALLS 14 COOPERSTOWN 11

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) accounted for eight scores and the Golden Eagles tied a season high with 14 runs but needed to hold off a late comeback to clip the Hawkeyes at Doubleday Field. Brennan walked and scored in the third, smashed a two-run single and scored in the fourth, tripled home three runs in the fifth and then singled and scored in the seventh as the Eagles built up a 13-1 advantage. Cooperstown roared to life in the home eighth with 10 runs on eight hits; 16 batters came up to the plate in the inning. Golden Eagle reliever Ryan Skoubo (Tacoma CC) finally halted the charge and racked up a four-out save. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) and Anthony Pisani (So. Maine) each had four hits for Glens Falls; Vigliarolo drove in two runs. Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) added three hits and scored twice. The Hawkeyes were paced by Bobby Guerra (Manhattanville) and Kyle Liner (Binghamton). Guerra slammed three doubles and scored three runs, Liner had three hits, drove in two runs and scored two more.

ONEONTA 6 ALBANY 4

ALBANY, N.Y. - Shane Crain (Louisville) and Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) each drove in one run in the seventh inning and the Outlaws' bullpen held Albany scoreless for the final four frames in a victory at Bob Bellizzi Field. Albany's Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) drilled a two-run double in the fifth to force a 4-4 tie. A two-out double by Shane Crain in the seventh put Oneonta ahead and then Crain scored on a base hit from Zander Wiel. Outlaws' reliever Matt Schmitt (Illinois State) entered in the sixth and spun three straight scoreless frames. Clay Bates (Clemson) retired the side in order in the ninth to earn the save. Zander Wiel went 3-for-5 with a two-run home run and three RBI to lead Oneonta and Shane Crain scored twice. Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) had two hits, drove in one run and stole three bases. Mike Triller (Clemson) smashed a two-run single in the second for Albany and Adam Young (UC Davis) totaled two hits and scored one run.

AMSTERDAM 6 MOHAWK VALLEY 5

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Ed Charlton (NJIT) slammed a two-run triple as part of a three-run ninth and Chase Williamson (Auburn) stranded the potential tying run on third in the home half of the frame to give the Mohawks a 6-5 win over the DiamondDawgs. Mohawk Valley led, 4-3, through eight. Amsterdam took advantage of three Mohawk Valley errors to score three times in the final stanza; Charlton's go-ahead triple put Amsterdam up one and a two-out error plated the eventual winning score. The Dawgs had runners on second and third with one out in the ninth. Following a Chase Williamson strikeout, a wild pitch brought in one run to cut the Mohawks' lead to one. The Amsterdam closer then ended the game with his second-straight strikeout. Scott Heath (Maine) led the Mohawks with three hits while Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) and Brian Ruby (Binghamton) each drove in one run. Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) totaled two hits and scored twice for Mohawk Valley.

NEWARK 6 ELMIRA 4

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Pilots tallied three unanswered runs to rally past the Pioneers at Colburn Park. Elmira's Spencer Brann (UC Davis) clubbed a two-run home run in the sixth and Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) pushed the Pioneers ahead, 4-3, with a seventh-inning sacrifice fly. Newark took advantage to two Elmira errors in the seventh and Austin Logan (UC Davis) slashed a two-run single to give Newark a 5-4 advantage. The Pilots added another unearned run in the eighth. Austin McAuliffe (NJIT) and Cullen Babin (Delta State) held off Elmira in the final two frames to seal the victory. Joe Landi (URI) had two hits for the Pilots along with one RBI and one run scored. Cash Barker (TAMUK) tallied twice as well. Spencer Brann plated three of Elmira's four runs and finished 2-for-3. Ty Yesensky (ODU) and Kendall Konopka also had two hits apiece for the Pioneers.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
