## **GLENS FALLS 12 ONEONTA 5**

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Tayler Saucedo (Tacoma CC) struck out 10 in 6.2 frames and the Golden Eagles scored eight times in the middle three innings to pull away from the Outlaws at East Field. Saucedo limited Oneonta to three runs on five hits; all of Oneonta's offense against Saucedo came in a three-run third inning which cut an early Glens Falls lead to 4-3. The Eagles answered back with two scores in the fourth, one in the fifth and five in the sixth to take a commanding 12-3 advantage. Alberto Morales (Clarendon) went 2-for-4 with four RBI to lead five different Golden Eagles with multi-hit games. Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) scored three times; Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) and Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) each drove in two runs. For Oneonta, Zac Johnson (Illinois State) dinged a two-run double in the third and Zach Lucas (Louisville) scored twice.

#### WATERTOWN 6 ELMIRA 5 (10)

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Edgardo Śalas (Alcorn State) scored on a wild pitch in the 10th inning to give the Wizards a walk-off win against the Pioneers. Salas scored two unanswered runs to help Watertown recover from a late 5-4 deficit. Elmira took the lead in the eighth inning on a three-run home run from Aaron Nardone (Delaware State). Salas walked to start the home eighth, stole second and eventually scored on a Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) RBI single. Salas led off the 10th and worked his second-straight walk. He moved to second on a Donald Walter (CPP) base hit. Derek Hagy (UTPA) beat out a potential double-play ball to send Salas to third with two outs, setting the stage for the winning run. Derek Hagy went 3-for-5 with two stolen bases and one RBI to lead four Wizards with multi-hit games. Watertown swiped a team season high eight bases; Hagy and Brandon Cipolla each stole two. Jonathan Perez (St. Mary's, Texas) fired two scoreless innings to earn the win. Zac Bellinger (VCU) recorded two runs for the Pioneers.

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9 Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs. Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
