WATERTOWN 20 ONEONTA 6

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Donald Walter (Cal Poly Pomona) scored five times and the Wizards reeled off a franchise record 20 runs en route to a win over the Outlaws at Damaschke Field. Walter's five tallies set a PGCBL single-game high for 2012. Walter recorded runs in the first, second, fourth and sixth as the Wizards built a 12-1 lead. He was hit by a pitch twice, doubled twice and added a single to finish 3-for-3. Following a four-score sixth, the Wizards exploded for eight runs in the seventh on six hits. A.J. Capone (Saint Rose) finished off the surge with a three-run double. The Wiz Kids mashed out 16 hits, nine players had at least one hit and 10 scored one run. Derek Hagy (UTPA) and Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) each tallied three times and collected three RBI. Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) added three hits and three RBI. Starter Matt McClain (St. Mary's, Texas) yielded just one run over six innings and pitched out of two bases-loaded jams in his second win. For Oneonta, Cody Hough (UC Riverside) went 2-for-2 with four RBI, Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) had three hits and two runs and Shane Crain (Louisville) was 3-for-4 with one RBI.

AMSTERDAM 7 ALBANY 2

ALBANY, N.Y. - Zak Colby (Faulkner) and D.J. Hoagboon (UAlbany) each knocked in two runs and Rocky McCord (Auburn) pitched six strong innings as the nationally-ranked Mohawks rallied to defeat the Dutchmen. Albany dashed out to a 2-0 lead with a pair of unearned scores in the first on a Ryan Gasporra (Centenary) two-RBI single. Amsterdam batted around in the fourth and plated four runs on six hits to go ahead 4-2. Zak Colby, D.J. Hoagboon and Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) all socked RBI singles in the rally. Hoagboon added another RBI base hit in the sixth and Colby connected on a sacrifice fly in the eighth. After the opening frame, Rocky McCord shut out Albany for the next five innings. He gave up four hits, walked three and struck out two in his third victory. Dan Zlotnick (Marist), Kevin Archbold (UAlbany) and Chase Williamson (Auburn) all threw a scoreless inning of relief to complete a four-hitter. Colby went 4-for-4 to lead a 15-hit barrage from the Mohawks which included five players with multi-hit games. Evan Stephens (Wake Forest) and Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) had two hits each and scored twice. Ryan Gasporra paced the Albany offense with two singles.

ELMIRA 11 NEWARK 7

ELMIRA, N.Y. - The Pioneers used a six-run sixth inning to ground the Pilots in front of over 3,500 fans on Monday night at Dunn Field. Newark and Elmira opened with a flurry over the first two frames and the Pios sprinted out to a 5-4 lead. The score remained the same until Elmira sent 11 men to the plate in the sixth and erupted for six runs on four hits. Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) capped off the scoring surge with a two-RBI single. Newark rallied late but Elmira relievers Lee Gilliam (UNCG) and Jimmy Yacobonis (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) forced the Pilots to leave a combined four runners on base in the last two innings. Elmira mashed out 13 hits led by Ty Yesensky (ODU) who was 3-for-5 with one RBI and one run scored. Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta), Zac Bellinger (VCU) and Aaron Nardone (Delaware State) all tallied twice and Clark Wise (Wofford) drove in two runs. Elmira starter Justin Bhatti (Norfolk State), after giving up four runs in the first two innings, blanked the Pilots for the next five. Josh Perez (Miss. College) paced the Pilots with three hits and two RBI, Brent Langston (Delta State) clubbed a home run and Joe Landi (URI) scored twice.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
