AMSTERDAM 5 MOHAWK VALLEY 3

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Jeff Limbaugh (Parkland) slammed a two-run home run in the sixth and three relievers allowed just one run over the final five frames as the Mohawks downed the DiamondDawgs at Vet's Park. Mohawk Valley led 2-1 through four. Amsterdam's Zak Colby (Faulkner) cracked an RBI single to tie the game in the fifth and then Jeff Limbaugh hit a two-run home run to center field in the sixth to give the Mohawks a 4-2 lead. Kyle Rufer (Schenectady County CC), Connor Kaden (Wake Forest) and Chase Williamson (Auburn) combined to allow one run on four hits; Rufer struck out four in 2.2 innings of relief to earn the win. Zak Colby, Jeff Limbaugh and D.J. Hoagboon (UAlbany) knocked in all five runs for the Mohawks and totaled eight hits; Colby went 4-for-5 with two RBI. Mohawk Valley's Jack Morrow (Young Harris) hit a solo home run in the ninth to tie teammate Eric Helmrich (Marist) for the league lead in long balls with eight apiece.

GLENS FALLS 4 ALBANY 3 (10)

ALBANY, N.Y. - Buddy Putnam (USF) plated Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) in the 10th inning with a sacrifice fly and that was enough to give Glens Falls an extra-frame victory over Albany at Bellizzi Field. Glens Falls scored three times in the second, Putnam slashed an RBI single and Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) rocked a two-run double. Albany scored the next three runs to force a 3-3 deadlock; Adam Young (UC Davis), Jared Martin (Cumberlands) and Jon Mestas (Buffalo) each drove in one run. Glens Falls' reliever Brandon Matthews (Yavapai) forced Albany to leave the bases loaded in the ninth and after Putnam's sacrifice fly in the 10th, Matthews ended the game with a double play and a strikeout. Neither starter figured in the decision; Ryan Peterson (Yavapai) of the Eagles tossed a four-hitter for 6.1 innings and struck out seven while Albany's Blake Smith (Morehead State) yielded just three scores in six innings and induced 13 ground outs.

NEWARK 3 ELMIRA 1

NEWARK, N.Y. - Daniel Thorpe (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) fired a complete game fivehitter and Austin Logan (UC Davis) swatted a two-run single in the eighth inning to lead the Pilots to a win over the Pioneers. Thorpe scattered five hits, walked two and struck out a season-high 12. He stranded eight Elmira men on base. Thorpe retired 11 of the first 12 Pioneers he faced and then ended the game with four strikeouts in the final two frames. Elmira's Craig Pearcy (Morehead State) was just as good; he allowed one run on three hits in seven innings and struck out six. Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) gave the Pioneers a 1-0 lead with a third-inning home run however Newark equalized in the fifth with a Cash Barker (TAMUK) sacrifice fly. With one out and the bases full in the eighth, Austin Logan broke the 1-1 stalemate with a two-run single through the right side. Elmira's Tyler McIntyre was the lone player with to finish with two hits. Newark and Elmira combined for just 10 hits total.

ONEONTA 6 COOPERSTOWN 2

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Logan Brown (Baylor) and Zach Lucas (Louisville) teamed up to score four runs and Sheldon Lee (San Francisco) pitched six strong innings as the Outlaws tripped up the Hawkeyes at Damaschke Field. Brown was hit by a pitch and scored on a Zac Johnson (Illinois State) sacrifice fly in the first and then singled home a run and scored on a base hit by Zach Lucas in the second. Lucas lanced a single in the first and dashed home on a groundout by Shane Crain (Louisville) and then he singled and scored on a Shane Crain base hit in the fifth. Oneonta tallied four times in the first two innings and never trailed. Sheldon Lee gave up only one run through six innings. He scattered seven hits, walked three and struck out four to earn his seventh victory tying Amsterdam's Chandler Shepherd (Kentucky) for the league lead. Steven Kandborg (Wenatchee Valley) and Quinn Pippin (Tulane) both had two hits for Cooperstown and Colton Beatty (Cal State Stanislaus) had one RBI.
