GLENS FALLS 9 ALBANY 2

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Tayler Saucedo (Tacoma CC) spun six shutout frames in a one-hitter and the Golden Eagles flew out of the chute with six runs through the first four innings in a win over the Dutchmen. Glens Falls has now won seven of its last eight games. Saucedo allowed just one single in the third, walked two and struck out six. He let two men reach second base and faced only two batters over the minimum. Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) tripled and scored on a Ross Kivett (Kansas State) sacrifice fly in the first and the Golden Eagles never trailed. Glens Falls added two scores each in the second and third and then one more in the fourth to amass a 7-0 lead. The Eagles mashed out 14 hits and six swingers racked up multi-hit efforts led by Casey Rodrigue who went 3-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored. Ross Kivett and Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) each had two runs batted in and Alberto Morales (Clarendon) scored twice. Relievers Wes Judish (San Diego) and Nick Pivetta (New Mexico JC) teamed up with Tayler Saucedo for a combined four-hitter. Morgan Phillips (Charleston) slammed a two-run home run for Albany.

MOHAWK VALLEY 11 AMSTERDAM 7

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - The DiamondDawgs pounded out a season high 16 hits and erupted for seven runs over the final three innings to knock off the Mohawks at Shuttleworth Park. Eight of Mohawk Valley's 16 hits went for doubles, a league single-game record. In a Shuttleworth slugfest, the Mohawks and Dawgs combined to score seven runs over the first three innings. Amsterdam, down 4-3, drew even in the fifth on a Brian Ruby (Binghamton) RBI double. However, Mohawk Valley broke the deadlock in the seventh with three scores to go ahead 7-4. The Dawgs plated one run on a throwing error and received RBI singles from Jack Morrow (Young Harris) and Tyler Hall (Herkimer County CC). Amsterdam responded with a single tally after the seventh-inning stretch but Mohawk Valley's Mark Stuckey (Marist) belted a three-run double off the Chain Monster in the eighth to give the Dawgs a five-run lead. Jack Morrow and Mark Stuckey each had three hits and three RBI to lead Mohawk Valley. Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) scored three runs and had two hits and Luke Nethaway (Herkimer County CC) drove in two scores. Six DiamondDawgs had multi-hit games. Chase Williamson (Auburn) hit his second home run in as many games for Amsterdam. Brian Ruby and Chase Green (SIU Edwardsville) each went 2-for-5 with one RBI and one run scored.

ELMIRA 8 NEWARK 2

ELMIRA, N.Y. - John Melville (New Haven) tossed a four-hitter for eight innings and the Pioneers scored eight-straight runs to ground the Pilots at Dunn Field. Melville shut out Newark through the first seven frames and finished the night allowing one run on four hits. He walked two, struck out one and forced 13 ground outs. Zac Bellinger (VCU) drove home a single Elmira score in the second with a two-out RBI double. The Pioneers added another run in the fifth on a passed ball and then three runs each in the sixth and seventh. Zac Bellinger highlighted the three-run sixth with a two-run double. Bellinger finished 2-for-4 with three RBI, Aaron Nardone (Delaware State) was 2-for-3 with two RBI and Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) cracked three hits and scored two runs. Spencer Brann (UC Davis) also scored twice for the Pios who banged out 10 hits. For Newark, Austin Logan (UC Davis) went 2-for-4 with one run batted in; Josh Perez (Miss. College) and Brent Langston (Delta St.) each tallied one run.

THIS DAY IN PGCBL HISTORY - July 6, 2011

Outstanding pitching performances were turned in by Albany's Steven Poche (SE Louisiana) and Watertown's Aaron Page (Dakota County Tech) in victories for the Dutchmen and Wizards respectively. Steven Poche threw a complete game four-hit shutout and struck out seven in an 8-0 win over the Elmira Pioneers at Dunn Field. Poche scattered four singles, faced three men over the minimum and did not allow a runner to move past second base safely in a game that was called after seven innings due to inclement weather. Aaron Page went the distance for Watertown in an 11-1 romp over Amsterdam at Duffy Fairgrounds. Page spread out 12 Amsterdam hits over nine innings and stranded nine Mohawks on base. At the time, it was the fourth complete game thrown in 2011 by a Wizards' starting pitcher.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary) and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
