ALBANY 6 COOPERSTOWN 1

ALBANY, N.Y. – Jon Mestas (Buffalo) and Adam Young (UC Davis) sparked a five-run explosion over the first two frames and Andrew Furber (Gloucester County) allowed just one score in seven innings as the Dutchmen downed the Hawkeyes at Bob Bellizzi Field. Young slammed a one-out triple in the first and came home on a Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) base hit. The next inning, Mestas cleared the pond with a three-run double and then he was chased home on an RBI double by Adam Young to spot Albany a 5-0 lead. Mestas finished with four RBI. Furber no-hit the Hawkeyes through three, allowed one run on six hits and stranded eight Cooperstown men on base. Albany totaled nine hits for the game and six went for extra bases. Jon Mestas doubled twice and Adam Young logged a pair of doubles and one triple. Cody Ellis (PHCC) scored two runs. For Cooperstown, Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) plated Patrick Hyde (NKU) with an RBI fielders' choice in the fifth.

AMSTERDAM 12 GLENS FALLS 2

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – Chandler Shepherd (Kentucky) spun a six-hitter through seven innings and the Mohawks scored at least once in seven of eight frames to smash the Golden Eagles at Shuttleworth Park. Shepherd, who earned his league-leading fifth win, scattered six hits, walked none and struck out four. He yielded a single unearned run in the fifth as he lowered his ERA to 0.26. Amsterdam's scoring barrage began in the first with a two-run home run by Chase Green (SIUE). The Mohawks went on to add two more runs in the second, one each in the third, fourth and fifth, two in the sixth and then one in the seventh. Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) and Brian Ruby (Binghamton) each had two hits, two RBI and two runs scored. Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) and D.J. Hoagboon (UAlbany) also tallied twice and Chase Green drove in three runs. Overall, six Mohawks had at least one RBI. For Glens Falls, Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis), Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) and Brandon Matthews (Yavapai) all had two hits; Vigliarolo scored both Eagles' runs.

ELMIRA 7 ONEONTA 6

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Clark Wise (Wofford) and Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) each drove in two runs and Spencer Brann (UC Davis) swatted a two-out RBI single in the eighth to cap off a wild comeback as the Pioneers thwarted the Outlaws. Oneonta charged out to a 6-1 lead in the fourth inning with a four-score outburst buoyed by Logan Brown (Baylor) who socked a two-run triple and then scored on a sacrifice fly. The Elmira comeback began with three two-out scores in the sixth; Clark Wise socked an RBI single and Kendall Konopka followed with a two-run base hit. The Pios surged ahead in the eighth with three more runs. An Oneonta error pulled Elmira within one and then Clark Wise leveled the score with an RBI single. Four batters later with two outs, Brann plated Wise with the go-ahead tally. Reliever Brice Smallwood (Morehead State) earned the win with two shutout innings of relief. Brann, Wise and Zac Bellinger (VCU) all had two hits for the Pios and Graeme Zaparynzski (Slippery Rock) scored twice.

NEWARK 8 WATERTOWN 5

NEWARK, N.Y. – The Pilots used a five-run sixth inning to fly out of a 3-3 tie en route to a victory over the Wizards at Colburn Park. Newark had an early 3-0 lead though Watertown managed to level the score with three-straight runs between the fourth and fifth; Derek Hagy (UTPA) tied the game with a two-run belt. Newark's offense came alive again in the sixth with five runs on four hits and one Watertown error. Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) split the 3-3 stalemate with an RBI triple and Joe Landi (URI) immediately chased home Bostick with a base hit. Adam Grace (Erie CC) finished off the five-run explosion with a three-RBI double. The Pilots mashed out 13 hits and Landi was the top gun with three hits and three runs scored. Josh Perez (Miss. College) had two hits and two RBI and Brent Langston (Delta State) drove in two runs. Derek Hagy paced the Wizards with three RBI, Jordan Enos (Holy Cross) cracked two hits and drove in one run and Donald Walter (CPP) scored three times.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular

season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
