WATERTOWN 7 GLENS FALLS 5

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) went 2-for-3 with three RBI and a game-saving defensive play to lead the Wizards to a road win over the Golden Eagles. Cipolla cut into an early 4-0 Glens Falls lead with a two-run swat in the fourth inning. With the tilt tied at five in the seventh, he ripped an RBI double to give Watertown the lead. In the eighth trailing 7-5, Glens Falls loaded the bases with no outs. On a fly out to center field, Alberto Morales (Clarendon) attempted to score from third but he was cut down at the plate by Cipolla from center field. Kole Mickolio (Utah Valley) then struck out the next batter to end the threat. The Wizards managed seven runs on just seven hits. Derek Hagy (UTPA) posted two hits and scored twice, Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) tallied two runs and Peter Rajkovich (San Joaquin Delta) gave the Wiz Kids a 5-4 lead in the sixth with a two-run double. Alberto Morales (Clarendon) slugged a sixth-inning solo home run for the Eagles and collected two hits to lead three different Eagles with multi-hit games. Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) and Ross Kivett (Kansas State) each had two hits.

ONEONTA 4 NEWARK 3

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) connected on a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth that scored Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) to give the Outlaws a walk-off win over the Pilots. Oneonta rallied back from three separate deficits in a game which featured three ties. Down the stretch, the teams traded runs in both the fifth and seventh innings to remain deadlocked. In the seventh, Newark's Joe Landi (URI) had an RBI single matched in the bottom half of the frame by an RBI sacrifice bunt from Orlando Rivera. In the ninth, the Outlaws filled the bases to the brim on two walks and an infield hit. With one out, Garcia lifted a fly ball to center that was caught but deep enough to plate Rivera with the winning tally. Oneonta's Brett Lisle (Virginia), Jeremy Rhoades (Illinois State) and Clay Bates (Clemson) combined on a four-hitter. Logan Brown (Baylor) and Zac Johnson (Illinois State) each had two hits for Oneonta, Cory Hunt (Utah) scored twice. Newark's Daniel Thorpe (St. Joseph's, Pa.) struck out seven in 6.1 innings.

AMSTERDAM 7 ELMIRA 2

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Mark Leiter Jr. (NJIT) struck out a season-high 10 and the Mohawks jumped on the Pioneers with a four-run first en route to a victory at Dunn Field. Amsterdam's four first-frame runs scored on five hits and two Elmira errors. Pitching with the lead, Leiter silenced the Pios' bats with a four-hit shutout over six innings. Relievers Scott Heath (Maine) and Chase Williamson (Auburn) combined with Leiter to strike out 14 Elmira batters. Zak Colby (Faulkner) scored twice for Amsterdam and drove in another run with a sacrifice fly. Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) and Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) each added two hits; Henderson, as a center fielder, also threw out a runner attempting to score from field on a fly out. Seven Mohawks had one hit and six different players scored runs. Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) paced the Pios with two hits and Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) had a two-run double in the eighth inning to break up a shutout bid.

MOHAWK VALLEY 11 COOPERSTOWN 3

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - The DiamondDawgs used a seven-run seventh inning and a two-hitter by John Means (Fort Scott C.C.) to hammer the Hawkeyes at Veterans Memorial Park. Means allowed one run on two singles, walked four and struck out eight over seven frames to increase his near league-high total to 42. Mohawk Valley carried a 3-1 lead in the last of the seventh on the strength of an Eddie Sorondo (Delaware State) two-run belt in the fourth. Mohawk Valley erupted for seven runs in the seventh behind seven hits and two Cooperstown errors. Tom Valichka (Young Harris) and Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) each drove in two runs during the offensive explosion. Mohawk Valley scored 11 runs for the second-straight game and pounded out 14 hits. Tyler Heck finished 3-for-5 to lead four Dawgs with multi-hit games. David Del Grade (Sacramento State) had two hits and scored twice and Eddie Sorondo tallied two runs. For Cooperstown, Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) clubbed a two-run home run and Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay) socked two hits.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
