MOHAWK VALLEY 15 WATERTOWN 1

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Joe Michaud (Bryant) tossed a two-hit shutout over seven innings and the DiamondDawgs scored a season high 15 runs on 15 hits to pound the Wizards. Michaud scattered two singles, walked none, hit three and struck out eight. He is 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA and 23 strikeouts over his last two starts. Mohawk Valley's offense scored early and often, sprinting out to an 8-0 lead through three innings. The Dawgs plated two runs in the first, five in the second, one in the third, two in the sixth, one each in the seventh and eighth and three in the ninth. Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) went 3-for-6 with three runs scored and two RBI, Hassan Evans (Herkimer County) recorded four scores, Eric Helmrich (Marist) belted a three-run home run and Tyler Hall (Herkimer County) had two hits, two RBI and two runs scored. The DiamondDawgs reached double-digits in runs for the third-straight game. For Watertown, Donald Walter (CPP) had one hit and stole two bases.

ALBANY 4 GLENS FALLS 1

ALBANY, N.Y. - David Stagg (Heartland CC) pitched eight strong innings and the Dutchmen scored four unanswered runs to upend the Golden Eagles. Stagg scattered seven hits, walked one, struck out nine and yielded a lone run in the fifth inning on a Ross Kivett (Kansas State) RBI single. Albany answered with two quick scores in the bottom of the frame on a Nick Chapman (UNCG) RBI base hit and an Adam Young (UC Davis) groundout to take a 2-1 lead. The Dutch added one run each in the seventh and eighth on an error and a Mike Jurgella (St. Cloud St.) RBI single. Stagg retired 10 of the 12 men he faced after the lone Golden Eagle tally and Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) pitched a perfect ninth for the save. Mike Jurgella, Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) and Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) each had two hits for Albany; Jared Martin (Cumberlands) scored two runs. Casey Rodrigue (LSU Eunice) topped the Eagles with three hits and Ross Kivett (Kansas State) posted his 22nd and 23rd stolen bases of the season to break the PGCBL single-season steal record.

AMSTERDAM 16 COOPERSTOWN 8

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Zak Colby (Faulkner) and Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) each smacked five hits and the Mohawks mashed out a season high 16 runs on 23 hits to win a Shuttleworth shootout over the Hawkeyes. The Amsterdam offense simply proved to be too much as the Mohawks scored at least one run in seven of nine at-bats on a league season-high 23 hits. A sixth-run third inning for Amsterdam broke a 3-3 tie and the Mohawks outscored the Hawkeyes, 11-8, over the final seven frames. After the six-score explosion in the third, Cooperstown would never come closer than five. Colby went 5-for-5 with a home run, three RBI and three runs scored while Boehm was 5-for-6 with three doubles, three runs and two RBI. Five different Mohawks had multi-hit games, five recorded at least two RBI and six scored two runs or more. Demarcus Henderson (Miss. State) had four hits, three RBI and scored twice. Cooperstown smashed 10 hits and scored eight runs. Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) had three RBI, Colton Beatty (Cal State Stanislaus) hit a two-run double and Coleman Barron (Davidson) was 2-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored.

NEWARK 12 ELMIRA 2

NEWARK, N.Y. - Joe Landi (URI), Josh Perez (Miss. College) and Brent Langston (Delta State) each drove in three runs and Derek Dallas (UT Dallas) twirled a two-hitter for seven frames to lead the Pilots past the Pioneers at Colburn Park. Dallas allowed two singles, walked one, struck out two and forced 13 fly outs. He did not allow a hit in five of his seven innings. The Pilots took off quickly with a five-run second inning propelled by a Joe Landi two-run double and a three-run double from Brent Langston. Landi added another RBI on a sacrifice fly while Perez used a sacrifice fly and two fielders' choices to drive three in scores. Newark plated six runs over the first three innings, added a single score in the sixth and then tacked on five more tallies in the seventh and eighth. Josh Crowdus (Delta State) scored three times to lead five Pilots with at least two runs. Adam Grace (Erie CC) had two RBI. Corey Hamula (Sullivan County) paced the Pios with two hits and Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) drove in one run.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular

season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
