## WATERTOWN 6 ELMIRA 4

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Calvin Graves (Franklin Pierce), Derek Hagy (UTPA) and Riley Norton (E. Okla. State) each drove in one run during the ninth inning as the Wizards rallied to defeat the Pioneers in front of 2,436 fans at Dunn Field. Elmira entered the final frame with a 4-3 lead thanks in part to a four-run fifth that was highlighted by a two-run double from Corey Hamula (Sullivan County). Graves drew Watertown even with a one-out RBI single that scored Donald Walter (CPP), Derek Hagy plated Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) with a sacrifice fly and Riley Norton slammed a double that scored Graves. Norton went 3-for-5 and scored two runs. The Wizards bullpen of Matt Nestor (W. Michigan), Drew Quinney (Savannah St.) and Kole Mickolio (Utah Valley) did not allow a run in 4.1 innings. Elmira starter Carson Bryant (Chattanooga State) fanned five in seven frames and was charged with two earned runs. Five different Pioneers had one hit; Stephen Clout (New Haven), Corey Hamula and Kyle Coronel (Binghamton) each collected one hit and one run.

### AMSTERDAM 8 MOHAWK VALLEY 4

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. – The Mohawks reeled off four scores in the eighth inning to pull away from the DiamondDawgs at Shuttleworth Park. Amsterdam began the eighth with a 4-3 lead. Mohawk Valley had tied the game in the top of the seventh on an RBI single from Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) and a sacrifice fly by David Del Grande (Sacramento State) only to watch Amsterdam go back ahead on a sacrifice fly by Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) in the bottom of the inning. In the eighth, the Mohawks scored four unearned runs on just one hit; the rally was capped off by a successful double steal involving Chase Green (SIUE) and Josh Nethaway (Albany). Green and Ed Charlton (NJIT) teamed up to record five of Amsterdam's eight scores; Green tallied thrice while Charlton had two hits. Starter Taylor Martin (Kentucky) yielded one run on four hits over five innings in a no decision; reliever Kerry Doane (ETSU) struck out four in the ninth. Tyler Heck led the Dawgs with three hits, including a solo home run, three runs scored and two RBI. Joe Carcone (Bryant) also had a pair of singles.

#### **ALBANY 7 GLENS FALLS 5**

ALBANY, N.Y. – Ricky Schafer (Cypress) pitched 4.2 scoreless innings of relief and the Dutchmen used a four-run third inning to cage the Golden Eagles at Bob Bellizzi Field. Glens Falls scored twice in the top of the third to go ahead 3-1. Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) responded with a two-run double to level the score and Ryan Gasporra (Centenary) then tripled home Remillard to put Albany on top. The Golden Eagles scored twice in the fifth however Schafer emerged from the bullpen to quell the rally. He yielded three hits, walked none and struck out seven to secure the win for the Dutchmen. Will and Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) combined to drive in four of Albany's seven scores and Jon Mestas (Buffalo) had a team high three hits. Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) of Glens Falls led all batsmen with four hits while Mike Vigliario (Saint Louis) amassed three hits and three RBI.

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9 Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs. Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
