### COOPERSTOWN 4 AMSTERDAM 3 (14) – RESUMED GAME

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. – Coleman Barron (Davidson) swatted a two-run home run in the bottom of the 14th inning to give the Hawkeyes a walk-off win over the Mohawks Sunday afternoon at Doubleday Field in a resumed game. The tilt originally started on June 6th and was suspended after 11 innings due to darkness with the score deadlocked at two. Amsterdam's Chase Green (SIUE) singled home Chase Williamson (Auburn) in the top of the 14th to give the Mohawks a 3-2 lead. Josh Ingham (CCSU) drew a one-out walk in the home half of the inning and two batters later with two outs, Coleman Barron sent a drive over the left-field fence to end the marathon.

### AMSTERDAM 9 COOPERSTOWN 3

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. – Thomas Bernal (Kentucky) drove in four runs and five Mohawks compiled multi-hit games as part of a nine-run outburst in a win over the Hawkeyes at Doubleday Field. Bernal drilled a two-run double as part of a three-run sixth and then smashed a two-run single to highlight a four-run seventh. The visitors from the Rug City bunched together eight-straight scores between the sixth and eighth innings to increase upon a 1-0 lead through five. Mohawks starter Chandler Shepherd (Kentucky) tossed a two-hit shutout over five and struck out seven. Chase Green (SIUE) and Ed Charlton (NJIT) each slugged solo home runs for Amsterdam; Green finished 3-for-5 with two runs. Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) added three hits while Bernal, Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) and Kerry Doane (ETSU) had two each. Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) paced Cooperstown with two hits and two RBI.

### MOHAWK VALLEY 3 ALBANY 2

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. – Eric Helmrich (Marist) went 3-for-4 with two RBI and five Mohawk Valley pitchers combined for eight scoreless innings in an exiting one-run win for the DiamondDawgs over the Dutchmen. Albany jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first on a Sam Few (Samford) RBI single and a wild pitch. Eric Helmrich cut the Dawgs' deficit to one in the home half of the first and then with the game tied at two in the sixth, Helmrich doubled home Chris Cruz (Cornell) from second with the eventual game-winning run. After yielding two tallies in the first, Mohawk Valley starter Cameron Sorgie (UAlbany) blanked the Dutchmen for four-straight frames. He finished with seven strikeouts. Mike Gaglianese (Purdue) Taylor Wright (Brown), Aaron Casper (Canisius) and Sal Lisanti (Bryant) all contributed one scoreless inning of relief. For Mohawk Valley, Jack Morrow (Young Harris) was 2-for-4 with an RBI double and Mark Stuckey (Marist) had two hits. Nick Chapman (UNCG) paced all Albany hitters with three singles and a stolen base.

### ONEONTA 5 ELMIRA 3

ELMIRA, N.Y. – The Outlaws used a four-run fourth inning to remain unbeaten with a Sunday evening victory over the Pioneers at Dunn Field. Oneonta trailed Elmira, 2-0, through three innings. Elmira's Graeme Zaparynzski (Slippery Rock) clocked a double in the home half of the third that, combined with an error, plated two scores. Oneonta's Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) opened the fourth with a solo blast. With two outs in the inning, Zac Johnson (Illinois State) doubled home both Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) and Clay Holcomb (Troy) to put the Outlaws ahead. Johnson capped off the rally when he scored on an Elmira fielding miscue. Aaron Nardone (Delaware State) pulled the Pios within one, 4-3, in the fifth but Oneonta's Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) put the game away in the ninth with an RBI double. Relievers Colter Bostick (Midland), Nick Cioffi (Towson) and Jeremy Rhoades (Illinois State) teamed up to allow just one Elmira run over the final five frames. Omar Garcia topped Oneonta with three hits and three stolen bases. Zac Bellinger (VCU) paced the Pioneers with three hits and Graeme Zaparynzski had two doubles.

## NEWARK 12 WATERTOWN 6

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – The Pilots pounded out 12 runs on a season high 20 hits to pummel the Wizards at the Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds. Newark scored single runs in the first and third innings and then took off with two in the sixth, two in the seventh, five in the eighth and one in the ninth. Seven of nine Newark starters had at least two hits while Pilots starter Daniel Thorpe (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) fired a three-hitter over seven innings and did not yield an earned run. Josh Perez (Miss. College) led Newark with four hits, Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher) belted a three-run home run and finished with four RBI, Brent Langston (Delta State) tallied thrice and Adam Grace (Erie CC) plated three scores. Josh Crowdus (Delta State) and Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) also had three hits apiece. Watertown rallied to score four runs in the bottom of the ninth but that was not enough. Donald Walter (CPP) and Dustin Exford (NE Okla. A&M) each had two hits and Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) poked a two-run single in the ninth.

**Division Format**

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBLL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

**Eligibility Requirements:** Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

**Roster Limit:** 30 players

**Playoffs:** August 3 - August 9

**Playoff Teams:** Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

**Format:** Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBLL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
