GLENS FALLS 4 ONEONTA 2

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) accounted for three runs and Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern) quashed an eighth-inning rally to help the Golden Eagles hand the Outlaws their first loss of the season. Meyers spotted Glens Falls a 1-0 lead in the first when he scored on a Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) RBI single. Meyers increased the advantage to 2-0 when he plated Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) in the third inning on a groundout. Golden Eagle pitchers Jake Doller (Kansas State) and Cory Folk (Buffalo) combined to three-hit Oneonta through seven and they allowed just one run. The Outlaws rallied in the eighth and trailed 3-2 after Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) scored on an error. With the potential tying and go-ahead runs on base, Jared Cheek ended the rally and the inning with a strikeout. In the home half of the eighth, Meyers drew a lead-off walk, stole second and scored on an error to put the home team back up by two. The Outlaws and Golden Eagles combined for just eight hits. Oneonta's Brett Lisle (Virginia) was charged with one earned run on four hits over six innings.

ALBANY 9 WATERTOWN 6

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) went 2-for-5 with three RBI and two runs scored and the Dutchmen reeled off eight-straight runs to down the Wizards at the Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds. Watertown plated five runs in the fourth to charge out to a 6-1 lead. Albany responded with a five-score fifth to pull even. Zach Remillard, who had an RBI single in the fifth, broke the 6-6 tie with a two-run double in the sixth and then he scored on an error in the eighth to complete Albany's 8-0 surge. Dutchmen relievers Ricky Schafer (Cypress) and Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) combined to strike out five in three scoreless innings; Lacosse struck out the side in order in the ninth. Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) and Brandon Haarer (Samford) collected two hits and one RBI apiece; Jon Mestas (Buffalo) scored two runs. Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) paced the Purple and Gold with three hits, Donald Walter (CPP) had two and Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) swatted a two-run single.

COOPERSTOWN 5 MOHAWK VALLEY 4

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. – Ty Morris (CSU Monterey Bay) and Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) hit back-to-back RBI singles in the ninth as part of a three-run rally that propelled the Hawkeyes past the DiamondDawgs at Vet's Park. Cooperstown began the ninth with a 4-2 deficit. Mohawk Valley had led since the first on a three-run home run by Eric Helmrich (Marist). Chris Robinson (Louisburg) was hit by a pitch with one out and he moved to second on a Josh Ingham (CCSU) single. With two outs, an error allowed Robinson to score and then Cooperstown sprinted to a 5-4 lead on back-to-back base hits from Morris and Mautner. Ingham retired the side in order in the bottom of the ninth to seal the win. Morris and Ingham each had two hits. For the Dawgs, David Del Grande (Sacramento State) smacked two hits, Jonathan Scott (Bryant) had an RBI single and starter Joe Perrotta (Lynn) gave up just one earned run in six innings.

NEWARK 15 ELMIRA 5

NEWARK, N.Y. – The Pilots set a single game franchise record with 15 runs on 15 hits in a home victory over the Pioneers on Monday night at Colburn Park. Newark buzzed out to a 9-0 lead through three and the Pilots scored at least one run in five of eight atbats. The biggest innings were the second and seventh; in both frames, the defending league champs scored five times. Josh Crowdus (Delta State), Josh Perez (Miss. College) and Joe Landi (URI) all had two hits and scored three runs; Perez added three RBI while Landi drove in two runs. Brent Langston (Delta State) led all Newark hitters with a 4-for-5 performance that included three RBI and two doubles. Eight Pilots overall had at least one hit and eight scored one run. Starter Andrew Tidwell (Saginaw Valley St.) fired a three-hitter through six, struck out three and allowed one run. Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) and Stephen Sunday (Sullivan County CC) each knocked in two tallies for the Pioneers and Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) clocked his league leading second triple. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
