WATERTOWN AT NEWARK – PPD RAIN

NOTEBOOK

*Tuesday marked just the second time in PGCBL history that an entire day of games during the regular season was lost due to the rain. Coincidentally enough, the only time this happened prior was nearly one year ago to the day on June 11, 2011.

*Thursday will be a league-wide day off for seven of the nine PGCBL teams. The only two teams in action on Flag Day will be playing in exhibition games against non-league opponents in front of local school children. The Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs host the independent New Rochelle Athletics at 10:30 a.m. and a half-hour later, the Watertown Wizards entertain the Syracuse Salt Catz of the New York Collegiate Baseball League.

*Speaking of exhibitions, there are other two exhibition games to note on the schedule coming up later in the week. The defending league champion Newark Pilots travel to Dwyer Stadium in Batavia to play an exhibition game against the New York-Penn League's Batavia Muckdogs on Friday evening. The Muckdogs are the short-season NY-Penn League affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals. And then on Saturday, the Amsterdam Mohawks will host the U.S. Military All-Stars traveling team for the second year in a row. The Military All-Stars played exhibition games against the Mohawks and the Newark Pilots in 2011.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9
Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.
Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
