ONEONTA 4 COOPERSTOWN 3 (10)

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Lucas Leifield (Grand Canyon) swatted an RBI single in the 10th inning to give the Outlaws a walk-off victory over the Hawkeyes at Damaschke Field. Oneonta ended a three-game slide with the win over its "Mayor's Cup" rival. Zach Lucas (Louisville) began the frame with a triple and after back-to-back intentional walks; Leifield poked a single into center field to end the game. Cooperstown had tied the tilt at three in the eighth when Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) scored on a wild pitch. Neither starter figured in the decision but both pitched well - Oneonta's Nate Abel (Virginia) yielded two runs over seven and struck out five while Cooperstown's Raleigh Rushing (Cypress) whiffed six in six innings and gave up two earned runs. Lucas Leifield, Zach Lucas and Logan Brown (Baylor) all had two hits apiece for the Outlaws and Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) hit a two-run double. For Cooperstown, Jacob Hubert socked three hits, scored twice and stole two bases; Bradley Vanderglass (NKU) also had three singles.

ALBANY 6 ELMIRA 5

ALBANY, N.Y. - Will Remillard (Coastal Carolina) launched a three-run home run in the first inning and the Dutchmen never trailed as they clipped the Pioneers in thrilling fashion at Bob Bellizzi Field. Remillard's first-inning smash was part of a four-score opening frame. Albany opened up a 5-0 lead through two though Elmira chipped away at the deficit with single runs in the third and fourth and two in the seventh. Dutchmen reliever Cody White (Southern Idaho) stranded the potential tying run on base to end the seventh. Elmira's Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) singled home a score in the ninth though with the tying and go-ahead runs aboard, Ricky Schafer (Cypress) recorded two-straight outs to end the game. Dutch starter David Stagg (Heartland CC) fanned nine in 5.1 innings to earn the win. Cody Ellis (PHCC) drove in two runs for Albany. Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) and Corey Hamula (Sullivan County CC) both had two hits for Elmira and Zac Bellinger (VCU) walked three times.

WATERTOWN 8 GLENS FALLS 3

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) and Dustin Exford (NE Okla. A&M) combined to drive in five runs as the Wizards hexed the Golden Eagles on Saturday night at East Field. Exford cracked an RBI double in the second and then drove in another run on a sacrifice fly in the third to give Watertown a 3-0 edge. The Wizards pulled away with a five-run sixth that was highlighted by a three-run double from Brandon Cipolla. Wiz starter Nick Bradley (W. Michigan) gave up one run through six and struck out three for his first win. Cipolla and Exford topped the Wizards with two hits apiece as did Christian Hickman (Alcorn State) and Riley Norton (E. Okla. State). Golden Eagle designated hitter Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) went 2-for-3 with two RBI and Dylan Bosheers (Tenn. Tech) had two hits and scored twice.

NEWARK 19 MOHAWK VALLEY 6

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Pilots set a PGCBL 2012 season high and a franchise record by scoring 19 runs in a lopsided win over the DiamondDawgs on Saturday night at Colburn Park. Newark scored at least one run in six of eight at-bats. Nine Pilots overall recorded at least one run, seven of nine scored multiple times and eight of nine had at least one hit and one run. The defending league champions broke the game open with six runs in the second and five in the fourth to amass a commanding 13-2 lead. Josh Crowdus (Delta St.) went 3-for-5 with four runs and two RBI, Brent Langston (Delta St.) drove in three runs, Joe Landi (URI) tallied three times and drove in two runs and Cash Barker (TAMUK) was 3-for-4 with three RBI and two runs scored. Three Newark relievers did not allow a Mohawk Valley run over the final 4.1 innings; Chris Rogers (Okla. Baptist) tossed 2.1 scoreless frames to earn the win. Jack Morrow (Young Harris) plated three of Mohawk Valley's six runs and Joe Carcone (Bryant) had a team high two hits.

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9
Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.
Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
