WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Taylor Martin (Kentucky) and Matt Gage (Siena) combined on a three-hit shutout and the Mohawks struck for seven runs on 13 hits in a win over the Wizards on Sunday evening. Martin scattered three singles, walked three, struck out three and forced three double-play groundouts in six innings. The Tribe starter also pitched out of a pair of bases loaded/no-out jams in the first and third innings. Gage seated all nine men he faced, six via strikeout. Amsterdam lead-off hitter Ed Charlton (NJIT) clubbed a solo home run to start the game and the Mohawks never trailed. NEWARK, N.Y. - Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico J.C.) clubbed a solo home run in the ninth inning and Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern) converted his league leading third save as the Golden Eagles rallied to edge the Pilots on Sunday night at Colburn Park. Newark's Adam Grace (Erie C.C.) doubled home Cash Barker (TAMUK) in the fifth inning to give the Pilots a 2-1 lead. Glens Falls scored the equalizer in the eighth when an error on a Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) single allowed Chris King (Louisburg) to dash home from first. Forcier's belt in the ninth gave the Eagles their first and only lead of the night. Cheek fired a scoreless ninth, his fifth-straight shutout appearance, to save the victory. Golden Eagle reliever Jordan Keysor (Skidmore) earned the win; he struck out three in two scoreless frames and forced Newark to leave the bases loaded in the seventh. Brandon Magallones (Northwestern) started for the visitors and struck out eight in six innings, allowing one earned run. Newark's Derek Dallas (UT Dallas) did not give up an earned run through six. ELMIRA 3 COOPERSTOWN 2

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Aaron Nardone (Delaware State) plated Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) with an RBI double in the eighth inning to propel the Pioneers to their first win of the season in front of over 3,000 fans at Dunn Field on Sunday evening. Cooperstown had forced a 2-2 tie in the top of the eighth on a Quinn Pippin (Tulane) sacrifice fly. Back-to-back singles in the bottom of the frame by Patterson and Ty Yesensky (Old Dominion) placed runners on the corners to set the stage for Nardone's game-winning heroics. The game was primarily a pitchers' duel between Elmira's John Melville (New Haven) and Cooperstown's Cody Cooper (NKU). Melville let in a single score on six hits over 7.1 innings while Cooper went the distance for the Hawkeyes and yielded three runs with five strikeouts. Elmira backstop Spencer Brann (UC Davis) threw out two runners attempting to steal and Ty Yesenky paced the Pioneers with three hits. Cooperstown's offense was topped by Bradley Vanderglas (NKU) who went 3-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored.

ALBANY, N.Y. - Brett Lisle (Virginia) pitched 7.2 strong innings and the Outlaws exploded for a season-high 10 runs to dropkick the Dutchmen in the Capital District. Lisle blanked the home-standing Dutchmen for seven frames and finished the night allowing three runs on six hits with four strikeouts. All nine Oneonta starters had at least one hit led by Shane Crain (Louisville) and Logan Brown (Baylor) who each had three; Crain bashed his first home run of the season. All of Albany's offense came in the eighth inning with four runs. Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) hit a solo home run and Ben Douglas (Southern Idaho) led the Dutch with a pair of hits.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
