ONEONTA 6 COOPERSTOWN 2

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - The Outlaws used a four-run first inning to gallop away with their fourth victory in a row and third straight over the Hawkeyes. Zac Johnson (Illinois State), Cody Hough (UC Riverside) and Sutton Whiting (Louisville) all drove in runs for Oneonta in the opening frame which was also buoyed by a pair of Cooperstown errors. The Hawkeyes cut the deficit to two in the fifth but RBI hits in the ninth by Clay Holcomb (Troy) and Logan Brown (Baylor) helped the Outlaws pull away. Oneonta's bullpen of Jeremy Rhoades (Illinois State), Colter Bostick (Midland) and Clay Bates (Clemson) did not allow a run over the final four innings. Logan Brown and Clay Holcomb led the Outlaws with two hits apiece; Brown scored two runs. Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC), Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) and Ty Morris (CSU Monterey Bay) all had two hits for the Hawkeyes; Morris had one RBI as well.

GLENS FALLS 12 NEWARK 2

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Ryan Peterson (Yavapai) threw a five-hitter over seven innings and the Golden Eagles pounded out a season high 12 runs on 16 hits to crush the Pilots at East Field. Peterson scattered five singles, walked none and struck out four. He shut out the Pilots in six of his seven frames and did not yield an earned run. The Glens Falls offense scored at least once in six of eight at-bats and it accounted for a trio of three-score innings, two of which came in the opening three frames. Alberto Morales (Clarendon), Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) and Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) each had three hits and scored three runs; Forcier added two RBI. Eight Golden Eagles had at least one hit and Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) recorded a team high three RBI. For Newark, Brent Langston (Delta State) and Jared Watson (Samford) both had two hits; Langston scored one run.

ELMIRA 12 WATERTOWN 9

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - The Pioneers sprinted out to a 9-0 lead and then hung on to defeat the Wizards at the Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds on Tuesday night. Elmira scored once in the first, twice in the second and then three times in the third and fourth innings to take a commanding lead. Watertown responded with five-straight runs only to have Elmira distance itself again with single scores in the seventh, eighth and ninth on a Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) RBI double and solo home runs from Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) and Aaron Nardone (Delaware State). The Wizards plated three scores in the ninth however with the potential tying run on deck; Miles Canady (Loras) struck out back-to-back batters to end the game. Elmira set a season high with 12 runs on 14 hits and five different Pioneers had multi-hit games led by Aaron Nardone and Steven Patterson who had three hits each. Nardone and Zac Bellinger (VCU) both scored three runs. Four Wizards recorded at least two hits; Christian Hickman (Alcorn State) paced the Purple and Gold with a solo home run and three hits overall.

AMSTERDAM 8 MOHAWK VALLEY 4

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Three pitchers hurled a combined five-hitter and the Mohawks scored five times in the fifth inning en route to their seventh-straight win and eighth overall. Amsterdam's Evan Stephens (Wake Forest) broke a scoreless tie in the third inning with a solo home run and Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) increased the Mohawks' lead to 2-0 in the fourth. The floodgates opened in the fifth with five runs on two hits and two Mohawk Valley errors. The DiamondDawgs responded with a four-run sixth inning but could not get closer than three. Amsterdam's Rocky McCord (Auburn) allowed one earned run on three hits and struck out six through six. Relievers Scott Heath (Maine) and Chase Williamson (Auburn) blanked the home side over the final three frames. Chase Green (SIUE), Jeff Boehm and Evan Stephens all had two hits for the Mohawks; Stephens, Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) and Nathan Gomez (Marshall) scored twice. Tom Valichka (Young Harris) swatted an RBI double and scored a run in Mohawk Valley's four-score sixth.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team
