ELMIRA 12 GLENS FALLS 9

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - The Pioneers struck for 12 runs for the second night in a row on a season high 19 hits to win a wild slugfest with the Golden Eagles at East Field. Elmira, winners of four straight, scored at least once in seven of nine at-bats and eight Pios had at least one hit. Elmira's Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) and Aaron Nardone (Delaware State) both drove in one run in the first inning and the visitors never trailed or let Glens Falls get closer than three scores after the second inning. Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) and Kyle Coronel (Binghamton) each went 4-for-6 with two RBI and two runs scored; Patterson clubbed his second clout in as many games and missed the cycle by a triple. Landon Prentiss (VCU) and Travis Rosenwinkle (Corning CC) added three hits apiece, Prentiss scored two runs. Aaron Nardone cracked two hits and swiped three bases. All nine Golden Eagle starting line-up batters had at least one hit. For the Golden Eagles, Ross Kivett (Kansas State), Alberto Morales (Clarendon) and Brandon Matthews (Yavapai) all had two hits and scored twice. Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) poked two hits and had two RBI.

MOHAWK VALLEY 9 WATERTOWN 2

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Chris Cruz (Cornell) went 2-for-4 with three RBI and John Means (Fort Scott CC) struck out 11 over 6.2 innings as the DiamondDawgs defeated the Wizards in front of 1,372 at the Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds. The Dawgs scored eight unanswered runs to erase an early 2-1 deficit. The eight-run surge began with a three-run rally in the fourth keyed by a Tom Valichka (Young Harris) two-RBI double and two Watertown miscues. Chris Cruz swatted a solo home run in the fifth, brought home another score with a sacrifice fly in the sixth and he ended his night with an RBI single as part of a three-run ninth. John Means scattered out five hits and did not allow an earned run in his second double-digit strikeout performance. Watertown's Rene Solis (St. Mary's, Texas) fanned nine in seven innings in defeat. Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) and Mark Stuckey (Marist) each scored twice for the Dawgs while Riley Norton (E. Okla. State) and Derek Hagy (UTPA) of the Wizards both had two hits.

AMSTERDAM 11 ALBANY 0

ALBANY, N.Y. - Connor Kaden (Wake Forest), Kevin Archbold (Albany) and Matt Gallup (Stony Brook) combined on a two-hit shutout and the Mohawks scored a season high 11 runs on 19 hits to rout the Dutchmen at Bob Bellizzi Field. Kaden yielded just a double through four innings and struck out nine. Archbold and Gallup teamed up to allow just one hit in the final five frames. A three-run home run in the fifth by Amsterdam's Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) helped the Mohawks charge out to a 5-0 advantage through six. The visitors added two runs in the eighth and four in the ninth. Altogether, 10 Mohawks had at least one hit and eight of those 10 recorded at least one hit and one run. Nathan Gomez (Marshall) went 4-for-6 with two RBI and one run scored, Evan Stephens (Wake Forest) had three hits and scored two runs and Scott Heath (Maine) went 2-for-2 with a two-run triple and two runs recorded. Morgan Phillips (Charleston) and Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) had the hits for Albany.

COOPERSTOWN 3 NEWARK 2

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Hawkeyes used three runs over the first two innings to ground the Pilots on Wednesday night at Colburn Park. The game was largely a pitchers' duel between Cooperstown's Daniel Hyatt (Louisburg) and Newark's Phillip Flach (Samford). Hawkeye Ty Morris (CSU Monterey Bay) doubled home Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) in the first and then scored from second on a wild pitch. Quinn Pippin (Tulane) plated Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay) in the second with what turned out to be the eventual game-winning run. Daniel Hyatt allowed one run on three hits through seven and struck out six while Phillip Flach yielded just two hits in eight strong innings. Newark scored single runs in the fifth and eighth on a groundout by Josh Perez (Miss. College) and an Austin Logan (UC Davis) RBI double. Cooperstown closer Josh Ingham (CCSU) snuffed out a Newark rally in the eighth as he recorded a strikeout to end the frame with the potential tying and go-ahead runs on second and third. The game lasted a season-low two hours and 11 minutes.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
