GLENS FALLS 8 AMSTERDAM 6

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - The Golden Eagles flew out to a 7-0 lead through six and then held off a late rally to end the Mohawks' 10-game winning streak. Ross Kivett (Kansas State) blasted a two-run home run in the first and the Eagles added five more scores in the sixth on four hits and one Amsterdam error. Glens Falls starter Brandon Magallones (Northwestern) twirled a no-hit shutout through six and struck out six before leaving due to a high pitch count. The Mohawks fired back with four seventh-inning tallies and then Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) slammed a solo home run in the eighth to answer a single score from the Eagles in the top half of the inning. Chase Green (SIUE) cut the Amsterdam deficit to two later in the eighth but that is as close as Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern), the Glens Falls closer, would allow. Cheek struck out four of the eight men he faced to earn his league-leading fourth save. Ross Kivett and Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) each had two hits, two RBI and two runs scored for Glens Falls. Chase Green topped the Mohawks with two hits and Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) scored twice.

MOHAWK VALLEY 8 ONEONTA 2

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Joe Michaud (Bryant) spun a five-hit shutout over six and Chris Cruz (Cornell) went 3-for-4 with three RBI to lead the DiamondDawgs to their third-straight victory with a win over the Outlaws at Damaschke Field. Michaud yielded five singles, walked two and struck out seven; he allowed just one hit after the second inning. Reliever Taylor Wright (Brown) did not give up an earned run over the final three innings. Cruz blasted an RBI triple in the fifth, drew a bases-loaded walk as part of a three-score sixth and then he capped off a two-run eighth with an RBI single. The Dawgs never trailed in the game and pounded out a season high 10 hits for the second night in a row. For MV, Mark Stuckey (Marist) was 2-for-4 with an RBI triple and one run scored and Luke Nethaway (Herkimer County CC) tallied twice. Connor Jones (Villanova) collected two of Oneonta's seven hits.

ALBANY 5 NEWARK 2

ALBANY, N.Y. - David Stagg (Heartland CC) and Ricky Schafer (Cypress) allowed two runs and combined to strike out 14 and the Dutchmen bunched together four runs over the first three innings to beat the Pilots. Stagg fanned a season-high 11 through seven frames and yielded just two runs on six hits. At one point, he seated nine-straight hitters between the fourth and sixth innings. Schafer blanked Newark in the eighth and ninth and he finished the game, facing the potential tying run at the plate, with a strikeout. Offensively, Albany scored three times in the second and once in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead. Adam Young (UC Davis), Nick Chapman (UNC Greensboro), Morgan Phillips (Charleston) and Ryan Gasporra (Centenary) each drove in one run during the stretch. Adam Young, Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) and Brandon Haarar (Samford) all had two hits for Albany; Zach Remillard scored twice. Ryan Gasporra drove in two Dutchmen runs without a hit. Adam Grace (Erie C.C.) was the top Pilot with three hits in four at-bats.

WATERTOWN 7 ELMIRA 2

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Nick Bradley (W. Michigan) pitched seven strong innings and the Wizards scored six times through the first five frames to give the Pios a knockout punch at Dunn Field. Bradley, in his second road win of the season, shut out Elmira for six of his seven innings pitched and allowed just two runs on six hits. He allowed just two Pios to advance safely past second base. Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) and A.J. Capone (Saint Rose) each drove in runs for the Wiz Kids in the second and then the Purple and Gold pounced for three in the fifth, two of which came on a Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) solo home run and a Jordan Enos (Holy Cross) RBI double. Cipolla socked three hits to pace the Wizards, Jordan Enos scored two runs and four different Watertown batsmen drove in at least one run. Clark Wise (Wofford) led Elmira with three hits including a fifth-inning double. A two-RBI single by Stephen Clout (New Haven) scored Wise and Ty Yesensky (Old Dominion).

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9
Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.
Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
