AMSTERDAM 3 COOPERSTOWN 1

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Nathan Gomez (Marshall) slammed a three-run double in the third and Chandler Shepherd (Kentucky) spun a four-hitter over seven innings to lead the Mohawks to their league-leading 12th victory. The Saturday evening game at Doubleday Field was largely a pitchers' duel between Chandler Shepherd and Cooperstown's Cody Cooper (NKU). Shepherd yielded a single run in the second on a Quinn Pippin (Tulane) RBI single. He walked two and struck out nine to win his third decision in three starts. Scott Heath (Maine) and Chase Williamson (Auburn) each added a scoreless inning from the bullpen. Cody Cooper limited the high-powered Amsterdam offense to three runs on five hits through eight. Cooperstown took a 1-0 lead in the second. Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) singled, moved to second on a sacrifice, went to third on a groundout and then scored on a two-out single by Pippin. A walk and a pair of hits by the Mohawks loaded the bases in the third and Gomez cleared the pond with a three-run double which provided all the Amsterdam offense.

ALBANY 3 GLENS FALLS 2

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Austin Chase (UAlbany) allowed just two runs over eight innings and three Albany hitters drove in one run each as the Dutchmen clipped the Golden Eagles in a pitchers' duel at East Field. Austin Chase held the Eagles to single scores in the fourth and eighth on six hits. He walked one, struck out 10 and stranded eight men on base. His counterpart, Tayler Saucedo (Tacoma CC) of Glens Falls twirled a two-hit bid through six, walked three and struck out eight. Saucedo combined with relievers Neil Fryer (Siena) and Cory Folk (Buffalo) to throw a two-hitter. Albany's Jon Mestas (Buffalo) plated Mike Triller (Clemson) with a bunt single in the third and a Jared Martin (Cumberlands) RBI single in the sixth un-leveled the score after a solo home run by GF's Ross Kivett (Kansas St.) in the fourth. The eventual winner for the visitors came in the eighth as Triller reached on an error and later crossed the plate on a Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012) sacrifice fly. Glens Falls closed within one in the eighth but Albany closer Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) forced the Eagles to leave the bases loaded in the ninth to end the game.

ONEONTA 10 WATERTOWN 8 (11)

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - Logan Brown (Baylor) smashed a two-RBI single in the 11th inning and Nick Cioffi (Towson) pitched out of a bases-loaded jam in the bottom half of the frame as the Outlaws won a four-hour thriller over the Wizards at Duffy Fairgrounds. The game featured 18 runs on 24 hits, 10 pitchers, 24 position players and two ties. Oneonta's Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt) forced a 7-7 tie in the eighth inning with a two-run single. Cory Hunt (Utah) broke the deadlock three frames later on an RBI fielders' choice and Logan Brown followed with a two-RBI single to push Oneonta ahead 10-7. Oneonta's Clay Bates (Clemson) entered in the eighth and tossed three scoreless innings though he loaded the bases in the 11th. Cioffi retired back-to-back Watertown batters for the first two outs of the stanza and then after yielding a bases-loaded walk, he induced a game-ending groundout. Zander Wiel drove in four scores for the Outlaws and Logan Brown tallied three runs. Watertown's Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) pounded Oneonta for four hits and he scored three runs and Jordan Enos went 3-for-5 with three RBI.

NEWARK 12 MOHAWK VALLEY 4

NEWARK, N.Y. - The Pilots put together two big innings and erupted for 12 runs on 14 hits to defeat the DiamondDawgs on Saturday night at Colburn Park. Newark struck six times in the third on six hits and then responded to a Mohawk Valley three-run fourth with four more scores on two hits in the fifth. Eight of nine Newark starters had at least one hit and five compiled multi-hit games. Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher) swatted a three-run double in third and tallied twice, Joe Landi (Rhode Island) went 3-for-4 with two RBI and two runs and Brent Langston (Delta State) drove in two scores. Four Newark pitchers combined on a six-hitter and did not allow an earned run. Reliever Sean Elliott (Indianapolis) struck out five men in two scoreless innings. For Mohawk Valley, Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) had two hits and Hassan Evans (Herkimer County CC) recorded two runs.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
