## **GLENS FALLS 11 COOPERSTOWN 3**

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Eight different Golden Eagles drove in runs and Glens Falls struck for a pair of four-score frames in a victory over Cooperstown on Sunday evening at Doubleday Field. Glens Falls opened up a 5-0 lead after three thanks to a four-run third inning; Danny Brennan (Saint Louis), Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) and Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) all plated scores in the frame. The Golden Eagles added two more runs in the sixth and four in the ninth. Danny Brennan and Brandon Matthews (Yavapai) each drove in two runs for the Golden Eagles; Matthews scored twice and bashed a solo home run. Emmanuel Forcier (New Mexico JC) led all Glens Falls swingers with three tallies, two hits and two walks. Eight Eagles scored at least one run and seven had at least one hit. For Cooperstown, Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) had a team high three hits. Quinn Pippin (Tulane), Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay) and Ty Morris (CSU Monterey Bay) all had one RBI.

## **ONEONTA 5 ELMIRA 3**

ONEONTA, N.Y. - The Outlaws set a PGCBL record with 10 stolen bases and Jeremy Rhoades (Illinois State) fired three scoreless innings of relief as Oneonta sprinted to a win over Elmira in front of over 1,100 fans at Damaschke Field. Six different Outlaws stole at least one base; Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) swiped three bags and Clay Holcomb (Troy) thieved two. Stolen bases led to all five Oneonta runs which were scored over the first six frames while the Outlaws opened up a 5-0 lead. The Orange and Black tallied twice in the first and then tacked on three single scores between the fourth and sixth on RBI hits from Cory Hunt (Utah), Heath Holder (Georgia) and Zach Lucas (Louisville). Elmira rallied to record three runs in the seventh but Jeremy Rhoades forced the Pios to leave the bases loaded to end the inning and he stranded five men on base in three frames. For the visitors, Kendall Konopka (Ariz. Christian) had two hits and two stolen bases.

## **NEWARK 7 ALBANY 5**

ALBANY, N.Y. - The Pilots rallied to score seven-straight runs between the seventh and eighth innings to earn a comeback win over the Dutchmen at Bob Bellizzi Field on Sunday evening. Albany boasted a 3-0 lead through six behind six shutout frames from starter Andrew Furber (Gloucester County). Newark exploded for five runs in the seventh with key RBI hits coming from Josh Perez (Miss. College) and Joe Landi (Rhode Island). The Pilots added two more scores in the seventh; Austin Logan (UC Davis) capped the frame with an RBI single. Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) and Ryan Gasporra (Centenary) each drove in runs for Albany in the eighth but the Dutchmen could not get closer than two. Austin Logan and Joe Landi each had two RBI for Newark and Josh Perez had a team high three hits. Starter Daniel Thorpe (Saint Joseph's, Pa.) struck out six in seven innings and allowed three runs to earn his third win. Zach Remillard topped the Dutch with three hits and Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) scored three runs.

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Hassan Evans (Herkimer County) and Tyler Hall (Herkimer County) combined to drive in six runs and Cameron Sorgie (UAlbany) tossed a four-hitter over seven innings as the Dawgs downed the Wizards on Sunday evening at Vet's Park. Evans broke a scoreless tie in the second with a three-run home run, his first of the season. He added an RBI double in the third and Hall followed with a two-run single to give the Dawgs a commanding 7-1 lead. Evans and Hall finished with five hits, six RBI and three runs scored between them. Jack Morrow (Young Harris) added a solo belt for the home side while Jesse Buratt (Baton Rouge CC) and Evan Wolf (UC Davis) each tallied twice. Cameron Sorgie struck out 10 and gave up just two runs on four hits. Aaron Casper (Canisius) blanked the Wizards over the final two innings. Donald Walter (CPP) swatted his second solo home run in as many days for the Wizards and he finished with two of Watertown's five hits.

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

**Eligibility Requirements:** Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

**Playoff Teams:** Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
