ELMIRA 6 COOPERSTOWN 0

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Dylan Waugh (Ariz. Christian) pitched a complete game six-hit shutout and Spencer Brann (UC Davis) went 2-for-4 with three RBI as the Pioneers blanked the Hawkeyes at Dunn Field. Waugh's nine-inning complete game shutout was the first of the 2012 PGCBL season and third all-time. Waugh scattered six hits, walked one, struck out three and he induced 16 ground outs. Brann mashed a two-run triple in the first inning and then poked an RBI single in the fifth. Elmira's other runs came on a Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) two-score double in the fourth and a Landon Prentiss (VCU) solo home run in the sixth. Six different Hawkeyes recorded one hit apiece. Cooperstown's Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) reached base twice with a double and a walk.

MOHAWK VALLEY 6 GLENS FALLS 5

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) accounted for four runs and Jack Morrow (Young Harris) ripped an RBI double in the ninth to propel the DiamondDawgs past the Golden Eagles at East Field. Heck reached base five times and finished 3for-3 with three hits and one RBI. Heck singled and scored on a throwing error in the fifth to break a 2-2 tie. The next inning, he followed up a solo home run by Luke Nethaway (Herkimer County CC) with an RBI double to spot the Dawgs a 5-2 lead. A successful double steal and a Ross Kivett (Kansas State) RBI single pulled the Eagles to within one in the seventh though it was Heck that answered as he walked in the ninth and scored on a Jack Morrow double. Mohawk Valley closer Sal Lisanti (Bryant) yielded an unearned run in the ninth but he forced Glens Falls to leave the potential tying tally on base. Luke Nethaway had three hits for the Dawgs and starter Evan Wolf (UC Davis) fired a four-hitter over six innings with five strikeouts. For Glens Falls, Ross Kivett was 2-for-3 with two RBI and four stolen bases.

AMSTERDAM 12 ALBANY 6

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Ed Charlton (NJIT) clubbed two home runs and Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) drove in five scores as the Mohawks won a wild game over the Dutchmen at Shuttleworth Park. Thirteen of the 18 runs scored came over the final three innings and 11 of those 13 crossed the plate in the eighth and ninth. Charlton slammed a solo swat in the first and dinged a two-run belt as part of a three-run sixth to help the Mohawks out to a 5-0 lead. Papaccio connected on an RBI double in the seventh to increase the Amsterdam advantage to seven and then he highlighted a five-score eighth with a three-run double. Albany responded to Amsterdam's fivespot with a furious five-run rally in the ninth in which Morgan Phillips (Charleston) and Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) each drove in two runs however the rally was not enough. Amsterdam starter Rocky McCord (Auburn) tossed a two-hit shutout through six and struck out a season-high 10. Giuseppe Papaccio had three hits to lead a group of four Mohawks with multi-hit games. Morgan Phillips and Zach Remillard combined to knock in five of Albany's six runs.

ONEONTA 5 WATERTOWN 4

WATERTOWN, N.Y. - The Outlaws scored five times over the first four innings and then held off a late charge by the Wizards to earn their 10th win of 2012. Oneonta plated two scores in the second and then three in the fourth to amass a 5-0 cushion. Lucas Leifield (Grand Canyon), Cory Hunt (Utah) and Zach Lucas (Louisville) all drove in one run each for the Outlaws. Oneonta starter David Sosebee (Georgia) struck out nine over seven innings and gave up just two runs, one earned, on five hits. Down 5-2, Watertown strung together a two-out rally in the ninth. Derek Hagy (UTPA) hit a two-out double and scored on an A.J. Capone (Saint Rose) RBI single. A pair of passed balls brought home Christian Hickman (Alcorn State) and placed the potential tying run on third. With runners on the corners and two outs, Oneonta's Spencer Thomas (South Georgia) induced a fly out to end the game. Lucas Leifield and Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) each had two hits for Oneonta and the Outlaws stole six bases. For Watertown, Riley Norton (E. Okla. State) and Derek Hagy each went 2-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game.
