COOPERSTOWN 10 GLENS FALLS 8

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Jacob Hubert (Laredo CC) smashed a two-run home run in the eighth inning and the Hawkeyes hit four home runs in a wild win over the Golden Eagles at Doubleday Field. Cooperstown trailed, 7-5, entering the bottom of the seventh. Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) pulled the Hawkeyes level with a two-run blast and Chris Blanton (CSU Monterey Bay) immediately followed with a solo belt to give Cooperstown an 8-7 lead. J.P. Rousseau (Western Nevada-2012-13) of Glens Falls scored on a wild pitch in the eighth to knot the score at eight. The tie did not last long as Hubert, the third batter of the Hawkeye eighth, dinged a two-run swat. The Golden Eagles put runners on the corners in the ninth but Cody Cooper (NKU) retired two-straight Glens Falls batters to end the game. The teams combined for 18 runs on 29 hits. Jacob Hubert and Chris Blanton each drove in three runs and Ty Morris (CSU Monterey Bay) added a solo home run. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) went 4-for-5 with a two home run, two doubles, two RBI and three runs scored for the Eagles.

ONEONTA 11 ALBANY 3

ONEONTA, N.Y. - The Outlaws reeled off 11-unanswered runs to earn their fourth-straight victory. Albany's Morgan Phillips (Charleston) doubled home two runs in the first and Nick Chapman (UNC Greensboro) hit an RBI single to help the Dutch open with a 3-0 lead before the Outlaws took their first at-bat. Oneonta responded with four runs in the home half of the first and then added three in the third, two in the fourth and two in the eighth. Lucas Leifield (Grand Canyon) hit RBI doubles in the third and fourth for the Outlaws; he finished 3-for-5 and scored twice. Zac Johnson (Illinois State) went 3-for-3 with two runs scored and Shane Crain (Louisville) tallied twice. Seven different Oneonta swingers had one RBI each. Starter Sheldon Lee (San Francisco) struck out eight over six innings and he held the Dutchmen scoreless after the first. Nick Cioffi (Towson) threw three shutout frames to earn his second save. For Albany, Nick Chapman and Jack Wietlispach (Parkland) had two hits apiece.

AMSTERDAM 9 MOHAWK VALLEY 4

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - D.J. Hoagboon (UAlbany) drove in two runs and the Mohawks bunched together seven scores between the fifth and sixth innings to dust off the DiamondDawgs at Vet's Park. Amsterdam, 2-1 leaders through four, took command with three runs in the fifth and four more in the sixth. Hoagboon sparked the rally with an RBI double in the fifth; he added his second RBI in the sixth when he was walked with the bases loaded. Ed Charlton (NJIT) and Evan Stephens (Wake Forest) also brought home Amsterdam runs in the sixth. Starter Connor Kaden (Wake Forest) gave up one run on two hits through five and fanned six. Relievers Scott Heath (Maine), Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) and Kevin Archbold (UAlbany) limited the Dawgs to three runs over the final four innings. For Amsterdam, Chase Green (SIUE) hit a solo home run and scored twice and Ed Charlton had two hits and recorded two runs. MV's John Means (Fort Scott CC) struck out seven in 4.1 frames and Jack Morrow (Young Harris) posted two hits including a solo home run.

NEWARK, N.Y. - Joe Landi (Rhode Island) connected on a two-RBI single as part of a four-run sixth inning that propelled the Pilots past the Pioneers at Colburn Park. Newark's four scores in the sixth erased a 1-0 Elmira advantage that was forged in the fourth inning on a Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) solo home run. Austin Logan (UC Davis) tied the game with a sacrifice fly that scored Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) with the tying run. Tyler McDonald (Millersville) followed with a two-out RBI single and two batters later, Landi capped off the rally with a two-run base hit to right field. Newark's Phillip Flach (Samford) tossed a three-hitter over seven, struck out seven and yielded one run. Elmira's Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) belted his second home run of the game, a two-run blast in the eighth, but Newark's Mark Scott (San Joaquin Delta) forced Elmira to leave the bases loaded in the ninth. Tyler McDonald, Joe Landi and Brent Langston (Delta St.) all had two hits for Newark. Elmira's Justin Bhatti (Norfolk State) struck out nine in 4.1 innings.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary) and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
