NEWARK 4 WATERTOWN 1

WATERTOWN, N.Y. – Three Newark relievers combined for seven scoreless innings and the Pilots scored three times in the ninth inning to pull away from the Wizards at the Alex T. Duffy Fairgrounds. With the game tied at one in the ninth, Newark loaded the bases against the Watertown bullpen. A sacrifice fly by Kane Sweeney (Morehead State) pushed the Pilots ahead and Newark took advantage of two Watertown miscues to add two more runs. Reliever Chris Rogers (Okla. Baptist) entered with the Pilots trailing, 1-0, in the third and he went on to spin five scoreless frames. Andrew Tidwell (SVSU) shut out the Wizards in the eighth and Sean Simonz (Okla. Baptist) retired the side in the ninth. Kane Sweeney collected two RBI for Newark on two sacrifice flies and Joe Landi (URI) tallied two runs. Watertown starter Rene Solis (St. Mary's, Texas) struck out 11 in seven innings and was not charged with an earned run in a no decision. Watertown pitchers allowed only three hits. Brandon Roush (UTPA) had one RBI for the Purple and Gold.

MOHAWK VALLEY 4 GLENS FALLS 2

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – Eric Helmrich (Marist) hit a two-run home run and Aaron Casper (Canisius) pitched three shutout innings of middle relief to help the DiamondDawgs double up the Golden Eagles at East Field. Helmrich broke a 1-1 tie in the sixth with a two-run blast, the first home run of the PGCBL season. Casper held up the lead as he struck out five and gave up only one hit between the fifth and seventh innings. Chris King (Louisburg) rallied the Golden Eagles with his second RBI of the night in the eighth inning but MV's Taylor Wright (Brown) pitched out of a basesloaded jam to keep the Dawgs ahead. Jon Scott (Bryant) pushed the MV lead back to two with a run-scoring single in the ninth. Jesse Buratt (Baton Rouge CC) scored twice for Mohawk Valley and Joe Carcone (Bryant) cracked two hits. Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) and Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) each had a pair of hits for the home side; Brennan added two runs.

ALBANY 2 ELMIRA 1

ALBANY, N.Y. – Ryan Gasporra (Centenary) worked a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the ninth inning to lead the Dutchmen past the Pioneers at Bob Bellizzi Field. Gasporra's one-out free pass with the bases full in the final frame plated Cody Ellis (PHCC) with the winning score. The home side loaded the bases for the eventual winning tally on a hit, an error and a walk. The game was largely a pitchers' duel between Albany's Austin Chase (Albany) and Elmira's Brandon Allen (Wabash Valley); each yielded just one run over six innings. Dutchmen relievers Steve Basile (Iona) and Trevor Lacosse (Bryant) allowed just one Pioneer to reach base in the final three frames. Five different Dutchmen had one hit apiece and Nick Champan (UNCG) drove in Albany's first score. Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) and James Pjura (Pace) each tripled for Elmira and Tyler McIntyre (CCSU) doubled and scored one run.

AMSTERDAM 2 COOPERSTOWN 2 (11) - Suspended due to darkness

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. – Wednesday evening's game between the Cooperstown Hawkeyes and the Amsterdam Mohawks at Doubleday Field was suspended after 11 innings due to darkness. All four runs in the contest were tallied between the sixth and eighth innings as Amsterdam's Rocky McCord (Auburn) and Cooperstown's Denis Buckley (Charleston Southern) matched one another with five shutout frames. Chris Robinson (Louisburg) and Josh Ingham (CCSU) had RBI singles for the Hawkeyes in the sixth. Amsterdam's Brian Doran (Maine) brought home Zak Colby (Faulkner) with an RBI ground out in the seventh and Chase Green (SIUE) leveled the score in the eighth with an RBI single that plated D.J. Hoagboon (Albany).

Thirty Players Taken in 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft

The 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year-Player Draft is complete and the dust has finally settled on yesterday's sprint to the finish with Round 16 through Round 40. The numbers have been tallied and a league record 30 players from teams in the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League were selected in the draft overall. Last year, 23 players were chosen. Through the first two days and 15 rounds of the 2012 draft. there were 11 players taken. The number increased dramatically on the third day of the selection process with 19 players called upon by Major League clubs. The 24th round was one of the highlights of the afternoon with three players from PGCBL teams chosen in a span of five picks. Looking at the numbers on a team-by-team basis, Glens Falls led the way with nine players drafted while Amsterdam and Oneonta had five apiece. Four Mohawk Valley players were selected while Albany churned out three draft picks including current Dutchmen infielder Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13). Cooperstown, Elmira, Newark and Watertown each had one former player taken. Thirteen of the 30 players tapped were listed on a PGCBL roster in 2011.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
