GLENS FALLS 11 AMSTERDAM 8

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. – The Golden Eagles scored three unanswered runs and Jared Cheek (Ga. Southern) threw three scoreless innings of relief in a victory over the Mohawks at East Field. Glens Falls raced out to an 8-2 lead through four innings however Amsterdam tallied twice in the fifth and four times in the sixth to level the score. Buddy Putnam (South Florida) pushed the Golden Eagles back in the lead with an RBI single in the seventh and Dylan Bosheers (Tenn. Tech) followed with a sacrifice fly. Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) tacked on an RBI double in the eighth. Cheek yielded one Amsterdam hit in the final three innings and he forced the visitors to leave the bases loaded in the eighth. The three-hour game featured 21 hits and at least one team scored in each frame but the ninth. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) drove in four runs for the home team and Alberto Morales (Clarendon) scored thrice. For Amsterdam, Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) ripped a three-run double in the sixth and finished with four RBI; Josh Nethaway (UAlbany) homered and scored three runs.

ONEONTA 4 COOPERSTOWN 2

ONEONTA, N.Y. – Zac Johnson (Illinois State) went 2-for-4 with two RBI and the Outlaws bunched together four runs between the sixth and eighth innings to defeat the Hawkeyes at Damaschke Field. Following a sixth-inning sacrifice fly from Clay Holcomb (Troy), Johnson broke up a no-hit bid from Cooperstown's James Norwood (Saint Louis) and unlocked a 1-1 tie with an RBI single. Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) added a sacrifice fly in the seventh and Johnson blasted an RBI triple in the eighth that scored Clay Holcomb. Oneonta's Taylor Hicks (Georgia) and Matt Schmitt (Illinois State) allowed just two Cooperstown runs on two hits; Hicks struck out seven in 5.2 innings. On the other side of the pitchers' duel, James Norwood gave up two hits in seven innings. For the visiting Hawkeyes, Coleman Barron (Davidson) doubled and scored one run. Chris Robinson (Louisburg), Quinn Pippin (Tulane) and Patrick Hyde (NKU) all walked twice.

WATERTOWN 7 MOHAWK VALLEY 6

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. – Ryan Filipowicz (Holy Cross) induced a game and rally-ending ground out with the potential tying run on second as the Wizards earned their second straight heart-stopping victory. Edgardo Salas (Alcorn State) smacked a two-run single as part of a four-run Watertown sixth that pushed the Purple and Gold into a 7-1 advantage. Mohawk Valley rallied in the ninth with five runs on four hits including a David Del Grande (Sacramento St.) solo home run and a Mark Stuckey (Marist) three-run double. Filipowicz entered from the Watertown bullpen and retired the lone batter he faced to end the game. Wizards' starter Bryan Chudy (Clarkson) gave up two hits over seven innings and yielded just one run. Seven different Watertown players scored runs; Christian Hickman (Alcorn St.) had two RBI. MV starter Joe Michaud (Bryant) fanned 10 in five frames.

NEWARK 9 ELMIRA 5

ELMIRA, N.Y. – Four Newark relievers combined for 4.2 scoreless innings and the Pilots took off with a four-run seventh inning to best the Pioneers in front of 4,182 fans at Dunn Field. The former PGCBL West rivals, in front of a jam-packed crowd, traded blows through the first five innings to the tune of a 5-5 tie. Newark's Joe Landi (Rhode Island) began the seventh-inning splurge when he scored his third run of the night on a two-out wild pitch. The Pilots added three more scores before the final out of the frame was recorded. Austin McAuliffe (NJIT), Phillip Flach (Samford), Ethan Humbert (RIT) and Sean Simonz (Okla. Baptist) allowed just two Elmira hits. The Pioneers rallied in the ninth and loaded the bases with two outs but Simonz ended the threat when he forced a game-ending groundout. Sean Osterman (St. John Fisher) went 3-for-3 with four RBI and two runs scored to lead Newark. Zac Bellinger (VCU) topped the home team with two hits and two RBI, Corey Hamula (Sullivan County C.C.) had two hits and scored two runs.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to

participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
