### WATERTOWN 5 COOPERSTOWN 1

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Rene Solis (St. Mary's, Texas) pitched a four-hit shutout for seven innings and Donald Walter (CPP) blasted a three-run home run as the Wizards grounded the Hawkeys. Solis scattered four singles, walked two and struck out five. Between the fourth and seventh innings, he retired 10 Hawkeys a row. Watertown took control with a four-run second. Conor Dishman (Wabash Valley) smashed an RBI single to break a scoreless tie and Donald Walter followed with his fifth home run of the season. Cooperstown's Raleigh Rushing (Cypress) gave up just three hits over seven frames but was charged with five runs. Watertown's Brandon Roush (UTPA) walked twice, scored twice and had one hit. Tyler Mautner (Buffalo) brought home Cooperstown's lone tally with an RBI groundout in the eighth.

### ONEONTA 8 ELMIRA 5

ONEONTA, N.Y. - The Outlaws scored three times over the first two frames and never looked back in a victory against the Pioneers at Damaschke Field. Oneonta has won three in a row. Zac Johnson (Illinois State) belted a two-run single in the first and Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) brought home another Outlaw score in the second to give Oneonta a 3-0 lead. Elmira scored five runs between the third and seventh innings but Pios could not get closer than one as the Outlaws were able to answer each time. Oneonta's Sheldon Lee (San Francisco) allowed three runs over six innings, walked none and struck out four for his fourth win. The two teams combined for 24 hits, each side had 12. Five different Outlaws had multi-hit games. Shane Crain (Louisville) and Orlando Rivera each posted two hits and scored two runs. Zac Johnson drove in three runs and Logan Brown (Baylor) had two hits, one RBI, one run scored and two stolen bases. Clark Wise (Wofford) topped the Pioneers with three hits and one RBI. Spencer Brann (UC Davis) drove in two runs without recording a hit and Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) was 2-for-5 with one RBI and one run.

### ALBANY 6 AMSTERDAM 2

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Matt Snyder (Va. Tech) pitched seven strong innings and the Dutchmen scored six two-out runs to mash the Mohawks at Shuttleworth Park. Snyder held the Mohawks to two runs, one earned, on six hits. He walked one, struck out four and induced three double-play ground outs. Albany erased a 1-0 Amsterdam lead on a two-out, two-run single by Nick Chapman (UNCG) in the fourth. Jared Martin (Cumberlands) worked a two-out free pass in the fifth with the bases loaded to force home another run. With a 3-2 lead in the sixth, Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13) clubbed a two-out RBI single to push the Albany edge back to two and then he added a two-out, two-run double in the eighth. Zach Remillard finished 3-for-5 with three RBI, Nolan Gage (UAlbany) and Adam Young (UC Davis) each had two hits and scored twice and Morgan Phillips (Charleston) cranked two doubles. For Amsterdam, Evan Stephens (Wake Forest), Brian Ruby (Binghamton) and Zak Colby (Faulkner) all had two hits; Colby drove in one run.

### MOHAWK VALLEY 4 NEWARK 3

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - David Del Grande (Sacramento State) scored on an Eric Helmrich (Marist) RBI single in the last of the ninth to give the DiamondDawgs a walk-off win over the Pilots at Vet's Park. Mohawk Valley has now won five in a row. Del Grande started the final half-frame with a triple and then back-to-back intentional walks loaded the bases to set up Helmrich's game-winning hit. The three-hour affair featured a pair of ties at 1-1 and 3-3. MV's Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) cracked a two-run single in the fourth to give the Dawgs a 3-1 lead. Newark's Ben Bostick (St. John Fisher) and Josh Perez (Miss. College) each drove in a run in the fifth to tie the score. Cameron Sorgie (UAlbany), Nathan Harrell (Hinds CC) and Aaron Casper (Canisius) of Mohawk Valley combined on a six-hitter and struck out 11. Casper fired three shutout innings of relief to earn the win. Tyler Heck, David Del Grande and Chris Cruz (Cornell) each had two hits for the Dawgs. Ben Bostick went 2-for-4 with one RBI and one run scored to pace the Pilots.

### Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

**Eligibility Requirements:** Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

**Roster Limit:** 30 players

**Playoffs:** August 3 - August 9

**Playoff Teams:** Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

**Format:** Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
