NEWARK 4 ONEONTA 3

NEWARK, N.Y. - Adam Grace (Erie C.C.) smacked a walk-off single in the ninth to propel the Pilots past the Outlaws at Colburn Park. Newark's Cullen Babin (Delta State) fired a two-hit shutout through eight and the Pilots built up a 3-0 lead. Oneonta took advantage of two Newark errors and a two-out, two-run double by Zach Lucas (Louisville) to tie the game in the top of the ninth. A pair of walks and an Oneonta error filled the bases for the Pilots in the home half of the final frame. Adam Grace came through with a single into right that scored Chris Doyle (UC Davis) with the winning run. Cullen Babin struck out eight in 8.1 frames and did not allow an earned run. Josh Perez (Miss. College) went 3-for-3 to lead four Pilots with multi-hit games. Josh Crowder (Delta State) had three sacrifices. Zac Johnson (Illinois State) paced the Outlaws with two hits including a double.

AMSTERDAM 8 WATERTOWN 5

AMSTERDAM, N.Y. - Jeff Limaugh (Parkland) launched a three-run home run in the eighth inning to lead the Mohawks to a comeback win over the Wizards. Amsterdam rallied from deficits for 4-0 and 5-3 to force a 5-5 stalemate. Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) hit an RBI single in the fourth, Giuseppe Papaccio (Seton Hall) a two-run triple in the fifth and D.J. Hoagboon (UALbany) a two-run single in the sixth. A single and a hit by pitch gave the Tribe runners on first and second with one out in the eighth and that led to Limaugh blasting a pitch over the Chain Monster in left to break the 5-5 tie. Chase Williamson (Auburn) retired the side in order in the ninth for his sixth save after Conor Kaden (Wake Forest) tossed two shutout frames of relief. Boehm, Hoagboon and Limaugh combined for seven hits, six RBI and four runs. Watertown's Brandon Cipolla (Holy Cross) blasted a solo home run in the first and finished 3-for-5 with two runs scored. Chris Glynn (UW Parkside) hammered a pair of RBI doubles and Cole Gleason (Wabash Valley) had two hits. A.J. Capone (Saint Rose) and Peter Rajkovich (San Joaquin Delta) both had one RBI.

MOHAWK VALLEY 5 GLENS FALLS 4

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Eric Helmrich (Marist) clubbed a two-run home run in the seventh inning and four relievers combined for 4.2 scoreless frames as the DiamondDawgs earned their eighth win in a row. Seven of nine total runs were scored between the third and fifth innings as each team rallied from a deficit, Mohawk Valley came from down 2-0 in the third and Glens Falls rallied back from a 3-2 deficit after three. An MV error leveled the score in the fourth and a Buddy Putnam (USF) RBI single pushed the Eagles on top 4-3. In the home seventh, Mark Stuckey (Marist) was plunked with two outs and Eric Helmrich followed with his co-league leading sixth home run of the season. Dawgs relievers Raymond Morton (NSU), Nathan Harrell (Hinds CC), Aaron Casper (Canisius) and Sal Lisanti (Bryant) limited the Eagles to just one hit from the end of the fifth inning through the ninth. Lisanti allowed a lead-off single in the ninth but stranded the potential tying run on base. Tyler Hall (Herkimer County CC) and Joe Carcone (Bryant) each had two hits for Mohawk Valley while Chris Cruz (Cornell) and Tyler Heck (Union, N.Y.) drove in one run each. Buddy Putnam topped the Eagles with three hits and two RBI and Ross Kivett (Kansas State) stole four bases.

COOPERSTOWN 15 ALBANY 11 (7) - SUSPENDED, DARKNESS

COOPERSTOWN, N.Y. - Thursday evening's game between the Cooperstown Hawkeyes and the Albany Dutchmen at Doubleday Field was suspended after seven innings due to darkness. At the time of the suspension, Cooperstown held a 15-11 lead. The game will be completed on July 31 in Albany before a regularly-scheduled game between the Hawkeyes and Dutchmen. Cooperstown will be the home team for those final two innings. Albany does not have another trip scheduled to Cooperstown. Thursday, the Hawkeyes charged out to a 15-4 lead. Albany rallied to score seven unanswered runs prior to the suspension. The two teams combined for 26 runs on 28 hits.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary) and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
