GLENS FALLS 11 ALBANY 7

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. - Kevin Meyers (NE Okla. A&M) hit a grand slam and the Golden Eagles scored 11 runs on a season high 18 hits to out-slug the Dutchmen at East Field. Meyers' grand slam broke a 3-3 tie in the third and gave the Golden Eagles a lead that they would not relinquish. Albany scored twice in the fourth but the Eagles answered in the home half of the frame with a Danny Brennan (Saint Louis) solo smash and a Chase Griffin (Ga. Southern) RBI single. The Dutch were never able to get closer than two. Wes Judish (San Diego) gave up just one run over five innings of relief to earn the victory. The game featured 18 runs on 34 hits. At least one run was scored in seven of nine innings and 14 of 18 tallies crossed the plate in the first four innings. Mike Vigliarolo (Saint Louis) paced Glens Falls with four hits and two runs, Danny Brennan went 3-for-3 with two RBI and four other Eagles each had two hits, one RBI and one run scored. Zach Remillard (Coastal Carolina-2012-13), Morgan Phillips (Charleston) and Jared Martin (Cumberlands) all had three hits for Albany; Remillard smashed a home run and scored three times.

ONEONTA 3 COOPERSTOWN 2 (10)

ONEONTA, N.Y. - Zac Johnson (Illinois State) ripped a two-run single in the bottom of the 10th to give the Outlaws an exciting victory over the Hawkeyes at Damaschke Field. Cooperstown led for most of the game on a Patrick Hyde (NKU) third-inning sacrifice fly that scored Bobby Guerra (Manhattanville). Oneonta forced a 1-1 tie in the eighth behind a pinch-hit RBI single from Zander Wiel (Vanderbilt). An Oneonta error on a single by Hyde in the 10th scored Quinn Pippin (Tulane) to spot the Hawkeyes a 2-1 lead. In the home half of the extra frame, Oneonta used a pair of two-out walks and a hit batter to load the bases. Johnson sent a smash down the right-field line that scored Orlando Rivera (State College of Florida) and Omar Garcia (State College of Florida) with the tying and winning runs. Neither starter figured in the decision of what was a pitchers' duel between Cooperstown's Chris Haggerty (Villanova) and Oneonta's Brett Lisle (Virginia). Each allowed one run on four hits over eight innings and struck out five.

AMSTERDAM 8 MOHAWK VALLEY 0

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. - Chandler Shepherd (Kentucky) pitched a one-hit shutout for eight frames and the Mohawks scored eight runs on 12 hits to down the DiamondDawgs at Vet's Park. Shepherd, who improved to 6-0, allowed just five base runners on one hit, two walks and one Amsterdam error. He retired the first 13 men he faced and yielded just a one-out bunt single in the sixth to Mohawk Valley's Chris Cruz (Cornell). Shepherd struck out nine and let just two runners safely advance past first. Dan Zlotnick (Marist) tossed a scoreless ninth. Amsterdam's offense accounted for five runs in the second and three in the seventh. Jeff Limbaugh (Parkland) and Ed Charlton (NJIT) each socked a two-run single in the five-score second. Limbaugh added another RBI hit in the seventh to finish 3-for-4 with three RBI. Zak Colby (Faulkner) also had three hits for the Mohawks and Jeff Boehm (Kentucky) scored twice. Five Amsterdam players drove in one run apiece.

ELMIRA 11 NEWARK 10

ELMIRA, N.Y. - Landon Prentiss (VCU) smacked a walk-off double in the ninth inning to give the Pioneers a wild shootout win over the Pilots at Dunn Field. The crazy contest saw Newark rally back from deficits of 7-2, 8-3 and 10-5. Newark scored five times in the ninth on four hits and one Elmira error to force a 10-10 tie. Joe Landi (URI) and Phillip Flach (Samford) each had RBI singles in the ninth and Flach's base hit was the Newark equalizer. Clark Wise (Wofford) walked to lead off the Elmira ninth and advanced to second on a Stephen Clout (New Haven) sacrifice bunt. With one out, Landon Prentiss looped a hit into center field that scored Wise with the game-winning run. The two teams combined for 21 runs on 25 hits. Landon Prentiss led the Pioneers with four hits and three RBI, Spencer Brann (UC Davis) hit a two-run home run and finished with three RBI and Steven Patterson (San Joaquin Delta) went 3-for-4 with a home run, three runs scored and two RBI. For Newark, Adam Grace (Erie C.C.) had two hits and drove in two runs.

Division Format

All nine teams play in one nine-team division. PGCBL teams in 2012 include the Albany Dutchmen, Amsterdam Mohawks, Cooperstown Hawkeyes, Elmira Pioneers, Glens Falls Golden Eagles, Mohawk Valley DiamondDawgs, Newark Pilots, Oneonta Outlaws and Watertown Wizards.

Eligibility Requirements: Player must have remaining collegiate eligibility to participate.

Roster Limit: 30 players

Playoffs: August 3 - August 9

Playoff Teams: Four, the top four teams in the standings at the end of the regular season qualify for the playoffs.

Format: Two rounds, each contested in a best-of-three series. The playoff semifinals will run from August 3 through August 5 and those will be followed by the PGCBL Championship Series which will take place from August 7 through August 9. In the divisional playoffs, the higher seed will host the first and third game (if necessary) of the series and the lower seed will host the second game. The same format will be used in the finals with the higher-seeded team hosting the first and third game (if necessary and the lower-seeded team hosting the second game.
